Bread.

It's what we take to celebrate the Eucharist. It's what Jesus describes himself in terms of in today's Gospel: 'I am the bread of life'.

Bread is the basic staple of life; it represents what we *need* to be alive, in contrast to the many other things we *want* but which may not bring to life what's deepest in us.

In describing himself as bread of life Jesus is saying that he will fulfil those deepest needs in us:

which is a paradox because in today's world so many are so out of touch with themselves that they have little contact with what those deepest needs are: the quest for prosperity, the diversion of computer games, the quick fulfilment of drugs and alcohol, the focus on sex at the expense of relationship,

all serve to keep human beings away from what is deepest within them.

As Jesus offers himself as our bread of life we have to first ensure that we know what true and deep hunger for the things of the Spirit is about. Otherwise he's food that we won't be interested in receiving. *Fr Colin*

PLEASE JOIN US FOR A FORUM FOLLOW UP MEETING ON THURSDAY 23 AUGUST AT 7PM SHIRLEY WALLACE CENTRE (ABOVE THE LINDFIELD CHURCH).

In late June our parish held a Forum on Child Protection and the Child Abuse Crisis in the Catholic Church. The Forum was well attended and an extensive amount of information was provided regarding the Royal Commission and the Diocesan and parish responses. At the forum we learnt a Royal Commission survey of Catholic Church authorities in Australia showed 4,444 claimants alleged incidents of child sexual abuse between 1 January 1980 and 31 December 2015, with 3,057 claims resulting in payments totalling \$268.0 million.

We also learnt that the Royal Commission found clericalism to be at the centre of an interconnected cluster of factors contributing to the crisis in which we now find ourselves. The main themes of the feedback received from the Forum relate to issues intrinsically linked to clericalism and the lack of transparency, accountability and accessibility which clericalism can lead to. The Parish Pastoral Council has written to Archbishop Peter Comensoli to provide feedback from our Forum. A copy of our letter to Archbishop Peter is available at the back of the Lindfield/Killara churches or from the parish website.

GLORIA:



STAIRWAY TO THE HEART Saturday 22 September, 10am ~ 4pm The Concourse Steps ~ 409 Victoria Ave, Chatswood

Stairway to the heart is a one day art event that invites people to reflect on how we are connected to those seeking safety from conflict and persecution. The Concourse stairway will host hundreds of small, clay human hearts. Each heart was made by one of more than 500 people (including students from Holy Family school and Lindfield Killara parishioners) who took part in Connecting Hearts Project workshops. (continued from p.8...) There is a marvelous story told about a four-year-old child who awoke one night frightened. In the darkness he imagined all kinds of spooks and monsters in his room. In fear he got up and ran to his parents' bedroom. His father calmed him and, taking him back to his own room, put on a light and reassured him with the words: "You needn't be afraid. God is here in the room with you!" The child replied: "I know God is here, but I want someone here who has some skin!" God knows we need him in more than the abstract. We need skin! That is why he chose to become incarnate in it. But he didn't shed his earthly skin after 33 years; once enfleshed, he has remained in skin. We are his body now. When we forgive, Christ is forgiving; when we bind, Christ is binding; when we console, Christ is consoling. When we suffer anguish over a loved one, the lamb of God is bleeding.

When people accept our love, they are accepting Christ's love. When their hearts are warmed and moved because we love them, they are being moved, and repentance is taking place, through Christ and the Holy Spirit. That is the mystery of the incarnation! It is true! Nobody can go to hell if they are loved by someone within the Body of Christ, providing they do not actively reject that love. Does this all sound incredible? I hope so because then maybe we will begin to see the tip of the iceberg: the huge mysterious, powerful, earthly and incredible mystery of the incarnation. One lady wrote to me saying: "I would love to believe you, but it just seems too good to be true!" What a marvelous description of the incarnation!

REFLECTING ON THIS SUNDAY'S SCRIPTURES

Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day.

CHRIST STILL HAS HUMAN FLESH

A man who was entirely careless of spiritual things died and went to hell. And he was much missed on earth by his old friends. His business agent went down to the gates of hell to see if there was any chance of bringing him back. But, though he pleaded for the gates to be opened, the iron bars never yielded. His priest went also and argued: "He was not really a bad guy, let him have another chance!" Many other friends of his went also and pleaded with Satan saying: "Let him out, please!" The gates remained stubbornly shut against all their voices. Finally his mother came, she did not beg for his release. Quietly, and with a strange catch in her voice, she said to Satan, "Let me in." Immediately the great doors swung open upon their hinges. For love goes down through the gates of hell and there redeems the damned.

A while back in this column I considered how we should react when some of our loved ones cease externally to practice as Christians. I suggested that because of the power given us by the incarnation ("Whatsoever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven. Whose sins you shall forgive they are forgiven"), our love and forgiveness binds our loved ones to the Body of Christ and forgives them, even if externally they have wholly or partially severed their relationship to church. Among other things, I stated no one can go to hell if they are loved by someone within the Body of Christ, providing they do not actively reject that love. I have received a lot of reaction, emotional and reflective, positive and negative.

For instance, a letter to the editor warned: "The Bible tells us that Jesus, the Lamb of God, takes away the sins of the world. The Bible does not tell us that we will be saved by accepting the love from someone in the Body of Christ. 'Jesus is the only way to salvation ... if you do not believe in the Son of God, you will not have eternal life with God but you will go to hell (no matter who loves you)." Another lady writes: "I firmly believe that, when we pray for the salvation of our loved ones, they will be saved—but because the Holy Spirit leads them to repent and not because we love them and somehow can expiate their sinfulness on our own. 'Love does cover a multitude of sins, but the sins covered are our own, not those of others!" These critiques, as they are written, are wholly correct. I have only admiration both for the instinct behind them and for their actual phrasing. I do not for one second dispute that it is only Christ, the Holy Spirit and personal repentance that can save. What I do dispute is the parameters within which these realities are often understood. Let me explain.

Only Christ saves, admittedly. But where is the reality of Christ? Was the incarnation only a 33-year experiment, a one-shot incursion by God into human history? No! The marvel of the mystery is that God took on human flesh and has never since ceased to have human flesh. In St. Paul's words, "We are the body of Christ." We don't replace Christ's historical body, we are not like his body, nor are we even his mystical body, we are his body; flesh, blood, tangible, in history, and to the extent that we live in grace, the on-going incarnation, God in flesh in history. *(continued on p. 7):*
