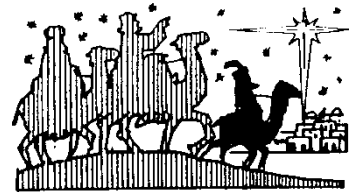
SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD 6 – 1 – 19

THE EPIPHANY

Today we celebrate the Epiphany which is a feast which complements Christmas Day itself (indeed in some cultures today is seen as the greater feast within the season). As Christmas Day celebrates the birth of the Lord, today's feast celebrates the *making known* of the Word made flesh, which is symbolised by the coming

of the wise men from foreign lands. In their coming we celebrate that people of all nations are embraced by God's love made flesh in Jesus.

The word 'epiphany' literally means 'a manifestation', a 'revelation' or 'showing'.

Today's feast invites us to take up our call as disciples to be 'epiphanies' ourselves – to make known the love of God, made flesh in Jesus, through our own love.

AN EPIPHANY REFLECTION

“The wise men come to worship, just as the shepherds do. That’s why they are wise; not because they know the means, the way, but because they know the end; not because they lift their heads to the stars but because they bow their knees to the Baby. Wisdom is not the pride of cleverness in knowledge, but the humility of holiness. “The fear of the Lord - that is the beginning of wisdom.”

‘Different from the shepherds in every way but one — rich, not poor; Eastern, not Western; clever, not simple; from afar, not from near; unearthly, not earthy — yet they are like the shepherds in “the one thing necessary”: Like Mary, they sit at Jesus’ feet. They know the end of their pilgrimage. They know the ultimate purpose of human existence: adoration of God and love of humankind in Christ, the God-man.’
