The 'unforgiveable sin'. What is it?

<u>Certainly not a sin that God refuses to forgive. But rather a situation where we close ourselves off from conversion and healing.</u>

Half-truths are whole lies, and half-truths are all too often the language of politics, the media, social media, the gossip-monger. And perhaps of ourselves?

The Great Lie is to 'demonise' someone and we see it in today's Gospel as it happens to Jesus himself.

His opponents don't like what he says and they don't like what he does. So they demonise him. They write him off. He's all bad. There is no nuance.

It's the stuff of our modern western world, that ultimate hypocrisy of constantly pointing out the splinter in someone's eye and being unable to see the plank in one's own.

Demonisation of the other is the 'unforgiveable' sin because the Holy Spirit is the Spirit of Truth and can only find a way into the soul of the one who genuinely seeks and loves the truth.

Part-truths are whole lies. The peddlers of half-truths have shut the door in the face of the Spirit of Truth. And today's Gospel asks us whether that reverence for the truth, the hard work of seeking the **whole** truth, *the non-demonising truth*, describes us? *Fr Colin*

Howard Thurman (1899–1981) compassion.

God is making room in my heart for compassion.

There is already a vast abundance of room for pity ... [including] self-pity, that sticky substance that ruins everything it touches.... There is pity in me-pity for is now that I see what my pity really is and the sources from which it springs.

God is making room in my heart for compassion: the go around and for everyone to have seconds. awareness that where my life begins is where your life But this world has a thousand forms of medicine too. begins; the awareness that ... your needs cannot be separated from ... my needs; the awareness that the joys of my heart are never mine alone—nor are my sorrows. 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
Are you or is someone you know considering becoming a Catholic?
