## Did you know?.....

#### **WOODS COTTAGE:**

#### A Community Project in the Lindfield Killara Parish



DIGNITY - QUALITY - RESPECT

The Woods Cottage project commenced in the parish of Lindfield, after 1981 (the "Year of the Disabled"). The cottage is named after the previous owner of the house, parishioner Tom Woods, who assisted the parish in 1983 to purchase his home for this important community project. Funds for the purchase were provided through substantial fundraising by parishioners, and a bank loan approved by the Archdiocese of Sydney, which established the Woods Cottage Trust for the purpose of ownership of the cottage, as a supervised group home for young adults with an intellectual disability.

The purpose of the Cottage is to provide community living for residents, rather than institutional style housing. The support service was funded by the NSW Government Department of Aging, Disability and Home Care (ADHC), until the establishment of the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) which provides assistance to the individual residents. The Woods Cottage Trust also received financial support from members of the parish through planned giving for many years and has received an annual grant from the Woods Cottage Foundation, established in 1995 with generous fundraising contributions from the parish.

Board members of Woods Cottage Trust are the Parish Priest and a dedicated group of volunteers from the parish. They have overseen service provision and the ongoing maintenance at the Cottage. In 2014 the Trust entered into an agreement with CatholicCare Diocese of Broken Bay, so that running of the support service could be fully administered by CatholicCare, funded from the individual clients' NDIS entitlements.

Woods Cottage continues as a community project of the parish. The Trust receives a regular annual payment of approximately \$75,000 from the Foundation, for the purpose of maintenance. The Woods Cottage Trust Board remains responsible for the upkeep & maintenance of the property where regular work such as roof replacement, painting, construction of a new laundry & plumbing upgrades have been carried out. Four residents live at the cottage, which is their home.

The Woods Cottage Trust Board, since 2018 has been investigating various options for creating extra accommodation at the cottage as well as longer term plans. This community project is an ongoing parish work by the Board assisted by CatholicCare .

## Food for the spirit

## The Kingdom of God is within you .....

In the Gospel Reading, Jesus says that the kingdom of God is completely now. like a mustard seed. When it is sown in the ground, it is the smallest of seeds; but it can grow to become the largest of

its size and become very big.

But why wouldn't the kingdom of God always be the same size?

To see the answer, you have to recognize that the kingdom of God isn't a peculiar kind of country. God's kingdom isn't a place at all. It's a condition, the condition of God's ruling as king.

But, we might think, even so, God's kingdom can't shift sizes. God's rule is always the same size: it's everywhere.

And yet this can't be right either. What is ruled by a king is governed by the will of the king. But how much of God's will does any Christian fulfil? Everything is subject to the will of God the King, for sure, but not every Christian who counts as being in the kingdom of God fulfils God's will

So this is the way in which God's kingdom can change size. When a Christian does what is against God's will, to that extent the will of God is not fulfilled in her. And so, to So, the kingdom of God can be very small, or it can change that same extent, the kingdom of God is small in her too. On the other hand, the more a Christian fulfils God's will in her life, the greater the kingdom of God in her is.

> This is one way we can understand Christ's parable of the mustard seed, then. When a Christian first opens himself up to receive God as Lord, the Lord rules very little of him. And so the kingdom of God is like the littlest seed in the ground of his heart. But if only he lets that seed grow in him, if only he doesn't give up on himself as fruitless and despair of himself, then that littlest seed of God's kingdom will grow and grow in him till it becomes like a great tree in him.

> In the end, though, here is the most important thing to see. If you have even just a mustard seed's worth of faith and obedience, you still have the kingdom of God within you.

We must promote a social and political culture that protects the rights and dignity of migrants, a culture that promotes the possibility that they can achieve their full potential, and integrates them. A migrant needs to be accompanied, promoted, and integrated.

Let us pray that migrants fleeing from war or hunger, forced to undertake journeys fraught with danger and violence, may find welcome and new living opportunities.




