

Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing the Lord.

We are always full of confidence when we remember that to live in the body means to be exiled from the Lord, going as we do by faith and not by sight - we are full of confidence, I say, and actually want to be exiled from the body and make our home with the Lord. Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing him. For all the truth about us will be brought out in the law court of Christ, and each of us will get what he deserves for the things he did in the body, good or bad.

GOSPEL: Mark 4:26-34 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

The mustard seed, the smallest of all the seeds, grows into the biggest shrub of all.

Jesus said to the crowd, 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time; he starts to reap because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Sunday, June 16 Ezekiel 17:22-24 Psalm 92:2-3, 13-16 2 Corinthians 5:6-10 Mark 4:26-34

We walk by faith, not by sight. (2 Corinthians 5:7)

Ruth was struggling with her teenage children. She loved them and prayed for them and set healthy boundaries for them, but their irritability and poor choices made her feel that she wasn't doing enough. Some days she even wondered if she was failing as a parent.

Then one morning she read this verse from St. Paul during her prayer time: "We walk by faith, not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7). As she read it, she felt a nudge from God to read it again. As she reflected on the things she was viewing "by sight," especially her children's struggles and her own doubts about herself, she felt God prompting her to see them "by faith" instead.

Ruth thought about how often she had reminded her children that she loved them and that God loved them. She thought about how she brought them to Mass every week, where they received Jesus' Body and Blood in Communion. She thought about how she had taught them to apologize and offer forgiveness to one another, and how they did it, even if it was begrudging at times!

Ruth also reflected on the passages from God's word that had meant so much to her, verses like Isaiah 54:13: "All your children shall be taught by the LORD; great shall be the peace of your children." And Matthew 13:31-32, where Jesus describes how the smallest seed can produce the largest of plants. Closing her Bible, Ruth's heart felt lighter and her mind felt clearer.

Think about a burden you are carrying today. Now, ponder today's words from St. Paul: "We walk by faith, not by sight." How is the Lord inviting you to view that situation by faith? Perhaps you could search out or recall Scripture passages that give you a renewed perspective. God has given you the gift of faith, and he is so pleased when you use it!

"Lord, open my eyes to see your presence and your faithfulness."



SAINT OF THE WEEK

SAINT PAULINUS OF NOLA, BISHOP Feast Day: June 22

C. 354 - 431

Patron Saint of bellmakers



Pontius Meropius Anicius Paulinus, known as Paulinus, was born in Bordeaux, modern-day France, into a noble family. As a member of the nobility, Paulinus would have received an excellent education in preparation for a career in civil service. When Paulinus was around age twenty-three, the Roman emperor, Gratian, appointed him as a suffect consul at Rome, a position held in high esteem among the ruling class. A few years later, the emperor appointed him as governor of Campania, a region that included Naples and many surrounding cities, including Nola.


The townspeople in Nola had a great reverence for the third-century martyr Saint Felix who was buried there. Inspired by their devotion, Paulinus built a road to make it easier for pilgrims to travel to his tomb, as well as a hospice where they could stay. The people's faith and devotion to Saint Felix stirred a desire in Paulinus for something greater, leading him to inquire into the Catholic faith.


After Gratian's assassination in 383, Paulinus moved to Milan to study the Catholic faith, most likely under Saint Ambrose. When he returned to Bordeaux, he continued his studies, was baptized by the bishop, and married Therasia, a noblewoman from Barcelona. Therasia's strong faith helped Paulinus to grow closer to Christ and embrace a more radical life of prayer and asceticism. When the couple's week-old son died, Paulinus and Therasia deepened their devotion and trust in God, feeling called to a more intense life of prayer and asceticism. They sold most of their possessions, donated the money to the poor, and mutually agreed to live in abstinence as husband and wife.

Paulinus' faith and good works led to his invitation to become a priest. After his ordination, Paulinus and Therasia settled in Nola, Saint Felix's burial site, since Paulinus attributed his conversion to the saint. The couple embraced a new form of monastic life that they invited others to join. They constructed a monastic center for pilgrims to Saint Felix's tomb, places of worship, and infrastructure for basic needs. They were very generous to the poor, even though they themselves lived in poverty. After Therasia died, Paulinus was chosen as bishop of Nola around 409, when he was about fifty-six years old, a position he would hold until his death twenty-two years later.

As bishop, Paulinus continued to spread the Gospel and generously served the poor. He also used his education to compose faith-based poems and hymns. Bishop Paulinus wrote many letters, some of which still exist. He was in written communication with the great Saint Augustine of Hippo, who even mentioned Paulinus in his classic, *The City of God*. Additionally, Paulinus corresponded with Saint Martin of Tours and Saint Jerome. Pope Benedict XVI praised Paulinus' writings as "rich in a lived theology, woven from God's Word, constantly examined as a light for life. The sense of the Church as a mystery of unity emerges in particular from them. Paulinus lived communion above all through a pronounced practice of spiritual friendship. He was truly a master in this, making his life a crossroads of elect spirits..."

Saint Paulinus, you found your true riches in your vocations of nobleman, poet, husband, priest, widower, and bishop – not in the wealth or prestige of the world. Please pray that I may embrace my vocation more fully, seeking only to advance the glory of God and the salvation of souls, beginning with my own. Saint Paulinus of Nola, pray for me. Jesus, I trust in You.
