SELF REFLECTION: UNDERSTANDING JESUS

In this Sunday's Gospel In John 18:33-37, Jesus stands before Pilate, who asks Him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus responds by clarifying that His kingdom is not of this world, challenging Pilate to think beyond earthly power and politics.

- Do I view Jesus as a ruler of a spiritual kingdom rather than an earthly one?
- Do I actively seek and listen to His voice in my life, or do I ignore it when it doesn't align with my desires?
- Do I stand firm in my faith, even when the world around me doesn't understand or accept it?

Lord Jesus.

Thank You for revealing that Your kingdom is not of this world, but is rooted in eternal truth. Help me to seek Your truth in every part of my life, to listen to Your voice, and to align my heart with Your purposes. May I not be distracted by temporary concerns, but focus on living as a citizen of Your heavenly kingdom. Strengthen my faith to stand firm in the truth, just as You did before Pilate. Guide me to reflect Your love, humility, and kingship in all that I do. Amen.

It is your own people and the chief priests who have handed you over to me: what have you done?' Jesus replied, 'Mine is not a kingdom of this world; if my kingdom were of this world, my men would have fought to prevent my being surrendered to the Jews. But my kingdom is not of this kind.' 'So you are a king then?' said Pilate. 'It is you who say it' answered Jesus. 'Yes, I am a king. I was born for this, I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth; and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.'

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Sunday, November 24 - Christ the King Daniel 7:13-14 / Psalm 93:1-2, 5 / Revelation 1:5-8 / John 18:33-37

I am. . . the one who is and who was and who is to come. (Revelation 1:8)

Today's feast of Christ the King marks the culmination of everything that our readings over the past month have been leading up to. Even as we live in the "already" (*Jesus has come!*) and the "not yet" (*Jesus will return and establish his reign forever!*), we take time today to declare that Jesus is King, both now and forever. He is "the one who is and who was and who is to come" (Revelation 1:8).

Just as Jesus is our eternal King, his kingdom is an everlasting kingdom. It reaches beyond time and space. And its population is unique: the "poor in spirit" are given places of honor, along with those who mourn and who are meek and lowly of heart (Matthew 5:3-5).

So what does it mean for us to be citizens of this wonderful, everlasting kingdom? How can the "already," the "right now," and the "not yet" truths of this kingdom affect our lives?

Jesus has *already* freed you from sin by his blood (Revelation 1:5). You can receive this freedom by faith and Baptism, by repentance, and by staying united to him through the sacraments.

Nothing can separate you from his love (Romans 8:39). Today, *right now*, you can invite Jesus to remove any barriers that keep you from experiencing the joys of his kingdom.

You will *one day* reign with the Lord (2 Timothy 2:12). It's awe-inspiring to think of, but in Jesus' kingdom, "Whoever humbles himself will be exalted" (Matthew 23:12). If you try to stay close to him in this life, he promises to give you a place near him as he reigns eternally (25:34).

Rejoice today that Jesus is your eternal King. Invite him to reign in your heart even more, as you await his reign of love over the whole world.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Catherine of Alexandria, Virgin and Martyr

Feast Day: November 25

c. 287 - c. 305



Patron Saint of apologists, apprentice milliners and seamstresses, archivists, attorneys, barbers, potters, spinners, the dying, educators, girls, jurists, knife sharpeners, librarians, maidens, mechanics, millers, nurses, old maids, philosophers, preachers, schoolars, schoolchildren, scribes, secretaries, tanners, teachers, theologians, and unmarried girls.

The legend of Catherine's life has long inspired the faithful. Born into a noble family in the flourishing city of Alexandria, Catherine's excellent education made her well versed in literature, poetry, rhetoric, philosophy, music, mathematics, and medicine. She also possessed exceptional beauty and moral virtue. Lacking a worthy suitor, she sensed a call to a greater life.

Catherine's mother, secretly a Christian, introduced her daughter to a monk who catechized and later baptized her. After Catherine's baptism, the monk encouraged her to beseech the Blessed Virgin Mary. While in prayer that night, Catherine fell asleep. Mary appeared in her dream with her Child who chose her as His bride, giving her a ring and calling her to embrace virginity. When Catherine awoke, the ring was on her finger.

When Catherine was in her late teens, Emperor Maximinus ordered all citizens to sacrifice to the Roman gods. Catherine went to the temple, sending word that she must see the emperor. Once in the emperor's presence, Catherine chastised him for his heathen practices and for requiring worship of false gods. The emperor was stunned at her beauty, character, wisdom, and elegant speech.

The emperor gathered fifty wise men to debate Catherine and prove her error. Just the opposite happened. Catherine's wisdom prevailed and won over many of the wise men. She cited the best Greek philosophers to prove her points and to support the truth that Jesus was the Savior and that the Trinity was the One God. When many of the wise men converted, the emperor had them killed.

The emperor next offered Catherine half his kingdom and a place in the royal palace. When she refused, the emperor had her scourged until her blood covered the ground, and he imprisoned her. While Catherine was in prison, the empress and the captain of the guard secretly went to her cell to listen to her. Both were so impressed that they converted and were baptized.

While in prison, a dove brought food to Catherine, keeping her healthy and strong. The emperor next threatened Catherine with torture on a large wheel meant to stretch her body and spin her to the point of death. Before Catherine was tied to the wheel, an angel made it spin out of control and shatter. The empress appeared to chastise her husband, revealing that she had become a Christian after listening to Catherine's wisdom. The emperor had his wife beheaded on the spot.

The following day, the emperor ordered Catherine's beheading. Within an hour of her execution, angels took her body away, laying it on the heights of Mount Sinai where it remained undisturbed. A few centuries later, a monk in the monastery at Mount Sinai's base, had a dream that led him to Catherine's relics. He took her body and buried it in the monastery chapel where she lies today.

Saint Catherine, you devoted yourself to God after learning of Him through a holy monk's teaching. Once wedded to your Lord, you never wavered in your love for Him. Please pray that I will hear God's Word in the depths of my soul and will respond to His voice with all my heart. Saint Catherine of Alexandria, pray for me. Jesus, I trust in You.




