

This must not happen with you. No; the greatest among you must behave as if he were the youngest, the leader as if he were the one who serves. For who is the greater: the one at the table or the one who serves? The one at the table, surely? Yet here am I among you as one who serves!

'You are the men who have stood by me faithfully in my trials; and now I confer a kingdom on you, just as my Father conferred one on me: you will eat and drink at my table in my kingdom, and you will sit on thrones to judge the twelve tribes of Israel.'

### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

Sunday, July 14 Amos 7:12-15 Psalm 85:9-14 Ephesians 1:3-14 Mark 6:7-13

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out. (Mark 6:7)

How do you think the apostles reacted when Jesus told them he was sending them out to preach, heal the sick, and drive out demons? Maybe they had a moment of panic, or at least some trepidation. They probably wondered if they could do what he was asking!

No matter how they felt, the Twelve were able to go out and minister to the surrounding towns because they believed in Jesus. If he was calling them to this work, then they trusted that he would help them to accomplish it.

That's the kind of faith we all need when God calls us to do something we feel unqualified or unworthy to carry out: Faith that Jesus is truly calling usand "sending usout" in some way. That kind of faithrequires you to trust that he has some kind of mission just for you and that through prayer or in Adoration, you will hear what he has in mind.

Faith that the Lord will equip usto do this work. You may see only what you lack, but the Lord sees all your gifts, some of which you might not even be aware of. He has confidence in your abilities, and he might even send you new gifts—as well as other believers—to help you.

Faith that our efforts will bear fruit. You might not see such fruit immediately, and perhaps you will never see it in your lifetime. But you can trust that the Lord had a purpose for you in mind and that if you are faithful to him, he will be faithful to you.

Where is God sending you today? It might not require you to "go" very far—it could very well be to your parish, neighborhood, or workplace. And unlike the apostles, you can bring more than a walking stick with you! What you do need is a heaping amount of faith—and the Lord will give it to you if you ask for it!



### SAINT OF THE WEEK

### SAINT APOLLINARIS, BISHOP & MARTYR

Feast Day: July 20

c. First Century - c. 79

Patron Saint of Ravenna and Emilia-Romagna, Italy Invoked against gout, venereal disease, and epilepsy

Most of what we know of Saint Apollinaris is rooted in legend. Popes in the sixth and seventh centuries encouraged his veneration, and in 549, Bishop Maximian of Ravenna, in modern-day Italy, dedicated a church to Saint Apollinaris that still stands and honors him as Ravenna's first bishop. Other churches were built in his honor in Rome, Bologna, France, and Germany.

According to one tradition, Apollinaris was born in Antioch, in modern-day Turkey. Saints Paul and Barnabas preached in Antioch (<u>Acts 11:26</u>) where followers of Christ were first referred to as Christians. Possibly, Saint Peter converted Apollinaris to the faith, or Jesus Himself might have sent him on a mission as one of the seventy-two disciples. Regardless, tradition states that Saint Peter ordained Apollinaris as a bishop and sent him to Ravenna to serve as that city's first bishop.

In Ravenna, Bishop Apollinaris preached the Good News, attracting many converts and performing miracles. At that time, Ravenna was an important port city for the Roman Empire. The predominant religion honored pagan gods and goddesses with temples and rituals. When Bishop Apollinaris preached the Gospel of Jesus Christ, many perceived Christianity as a direct threat to their way of life and beliefs. Citizens beat Apollinaris and drove him out of the city. He was found close to death on the seashore, where fellow Christians rescued and hid him.

Determined to complete his mission, Bishop Apollinaris returned to Ravenna. He was captured, forced to walk on burning coals, and again expelled from the city. He then traveled west about sixty miles to modern-day Emilia-Romagna, where he continued his mission, winning many converts.

Undeterred from converting the people of Ravenna, Bishop Apollinaris returned for a third time. This time, it is said that he was cut with knives and had scalding water poured on his wounds. His abusers silenced his preaching by beating his mouth with rocks. After several days chained in a dungeon, he was ejected from the city again and placed on a ship to Greece. In Greece, Bishop Apollinaris preached and performed miracles. After he won many converts, the local pagan priests complained that his presence was disrupting their communication with the gods and goddesses. Bishop Apollinaris was placed on a ship and returned to Ravenna.

By the time Bishop Apollinaris returned to Ravenna, Vespasian was the Roman emperor. While Vespasian did not engage in an empire-wide persecution of Christians, he ordered the exile of certain Christians, including Bishop Apollinaris. After being dragged out of the city a fourth time, Apollinaris was beaten in Classis, just south of Ravenna, and again left for dead. Whether he died as a result of this final beating is unknown, but he is honored as a martyr on the Church's liturgical calendar. Saint Apollinaris is believed to have served as the first Bishop of Ravenna for twenty to twenty-six years.

Historical evidence from the seventh century suggests that he might have lived a century later, dying during the persecution of Emperor Septimius Severus in the late second century.

Saint Apollinaris, persecution, beatings, and exile did not deter you from fulfilling your mission of winning souls for the Kingdom of God. Please pray that I will discover the same courage that you had and fulfill my mission with unwavering faith. Saint Apollinaris, pray for me. Jesus, I trust in You.
