

As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father,


so whoever eats me will draw life from me.

#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

Sunday, August 18 Proverbs 9:1-6 Psalm 34:2-7 Ephesians 5:15-20 John 6:51-58

#### My flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. (John 6:55)

In 1975, while traveling to Saigon, Vietnamese Bishop Francis Xavier Nguyen Van Thuan was arrested and thrown into prison. His family sent him a bottle labeled "medicine," which was actually wine, as well as some hosts broken into small pieces. With these essentials, he shared the power of Jesus in the Eucharist with his fellow prisoners: "The six Catholics in my group of fifty prisoners . . . slept close together in order to be able to pray during the night. At nine-thirty every evening . . . , I bent over my wooden board and celebrated Mass, by heart of course, and distributed Communion to my neighbors under their mosquito nets. We made tiny bags from cigarette paper to protect the Blessed Sacrament.

"Every week there was an indoctrination session. . . . My Catholic companions took advantage of the break to pass around the Blessed Sacrament to other groups. Jesus Christ was at work, curing physical and mental suffering. Many of the others who had lost their faith came back during those days.

"At night, the prisoners took turns and spent time in adoration. The Blessed Sacrament helped tremendously. Even Buddhists and other non-Christians were converted. The strength of the love of Jesus is irresistible. The darkness of the prison turned into light, the seed germinated silently in the storm.

"I spent nine years in solitary confinement, and during that time I said Mass every day at three o'clock, the hour of Jesus' death on the cross. . . . They were the most beautiful Masses of my life." (Road to Hope)

After thirteen years in prison, Bishop Nguyen Van Thuan was released. Named a cardinal in 2001, he died a year later. All his life, Jesus in the Eucharist was his "true food" and "true drink" (John 6:55). May the Eucharistic Lord always be ours as well!

"Jesus, Bread from Heaven, nourish and sustain me all the days of my life!"





### SAINT OF THE WEEK

#### SAINT ROSE OF LIMA, VIRGIN

Feast Day: August 23 c. 1586-1617

Patron Saint of the Americas, Peru, embroiderers, florists, gardeners, needleworkers, and people ridiculed for their piety
Invoked against vanity and self-love



Saint Rose was born in Lima in Spain's new Viceroyalty of Peru, fifty-five years after Spanish colonization of the territory. Named Isabel Flores de Oliva, she was the seventh of eleven children. She was nicknamed "Rose" when one of the family servants said she saw the infant's face transform into a rose. Her Spanish father was a member of the army. Her mother was of mixed Peruvian and Spanish ancestry. Both were devout Catholics who instilled a deep faith in their children. Even as a child, Isabel prayed for long periods in the middle of the night before a shrine she set up in her room. At age eleven, she received the Sacrament of Confirmation and took the name Rose.

Roses's physical beauty made her an ideal future spouse in young men's eyes. Rose, however, wanted to become a nun. To make her beauty less of a distraction or temptation, she cut off her hair and rubbed pepper on her face and lime juice on her hands to make her skin less appealing. Rose's father eventually acquiesced to her desire not to marry, letting her live in a small hut on the family property where she could be with her divine Spouse through solitude and prayer.

There, Rose engaged in charitable works. She fed the poor and nursed the sick back to health. She supported herself and her struggling family by selling handmade lace and embroidery and flowers she grew. She emulated Saint Catherine of Siena by practicing severe penances, sleeping on a hard floor, wearing a crown of thorns while alone in her room, fasting, and inflicting penances upon herself that opened the door to spiritual abundance. She went to Mass daily and adored the Blessed Sacrament. When she turned twenty, she followed in Saint Catherine of Siena's footsteps, becoming a lay member of the Third Order of Saint Dominic. She carried on her life of continuous prayer and penance, sleeping only two hours a night so she could pray more. Her selfmade bed consisted of broken glass, stone, potsherds, and thorns. Roses concealed the metal spikes on the crown of thorns that she wore continuously, and she wore a chain of spikes around her waist. Her fasts were extreme, her penances doubled, but Rose could not have been happier.

For the next eleven years, Rose continued her charitable works and entered deeply into what has been called 'spiritual marriage' with Jesus. She frequently conversed with and received spiritual guidance from Jesus, Mary, and the saints. She entered into ecstasies and raptures, experiencing untold interior spiritual favors from her Lord. She also received long periods of exceptionally painful spiritual dryness, an interior cross that produced abundant good fruit as she persevered in her fidelity and deepened her divine union with Her Spouse. As her interior purifications were completed and she detached from selfishness, her soul was flooded with Jesus' presence.

Rose died at age thirty-one and was quickly acknowledged as a saint. About fifty years after her birth into Heaven, she was canonized as the first saint from the Americas. Miraculous healings had been attributed to her intercession while she was alive, and they continued after her death. One legend states that after her death, all of Lima smelled of roses that fell from the sky.

Saint Rose of Lima, you fell in love with your Lord and could choose no one else. Jesus transformed you into a beacon of light that shone forth from your small hermitage. Please pray that through a life of prayer and penance, I will enter into union with my Lord. Saint Rose of Lima, pray for me. Jesus I trust in You.
