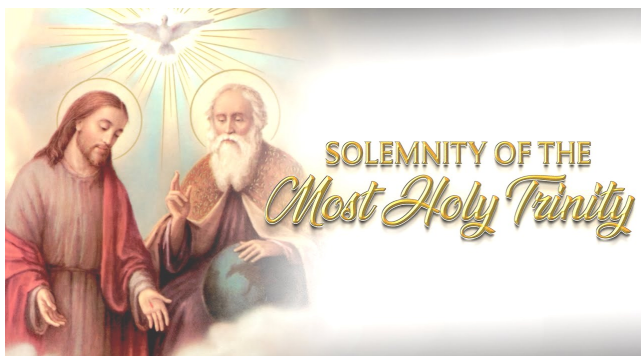

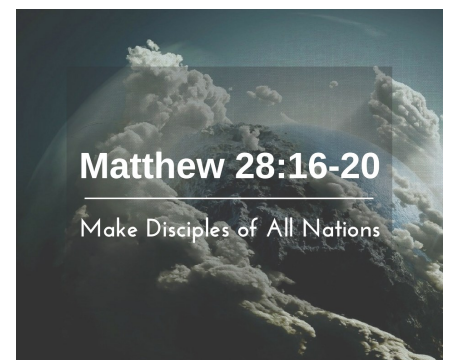

GOSPEL REFLECTION
Sunday, May 26 The Holy Trinity
Deuteronomy 4:32-34, 39-40
Psalms 33:4-6, 9, 18-20, 22
Romans 8:14-17
Matthew 28:16-20

Know, and fix in your heart, that the LORD is God. (Deuteronomy 4:39)

What a beautiful reading for today's feast of the Holy Trinity! Moses' words to the Israelites tell us that there is only one God: "the LORD" (Deuteronomy 4:39). And he is a wonderful God! He is generous and kind, not like the false gods that the pagans worshipped. He is so kind, in fact, that he rescued his people from slavery and led them into the Promised Land (Deuteronomy 4:34). No pagan could say anything like that about their "god"!

Now, with the coming of Christ, we have an even greater understanding of who this one true God truly is. And at the heart of that understanding is the proclamation that our God is a Trinity of Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

As *Father*, he treats us with great love and calls us into his family. He welcomes us into his throne room and promises to hear us when we call to him.

As *Son*, he takes on our own humanity and offers that humanity in sacrifice on a cross. And through that cross, he destroys the power of sin and showers us with mercy.

As *Spirit*, he pours his very life and love into us. He empowers us to live the life we've been called to—a life of love and mercy that mirrors the love of our heavenly Father.

This is our God! But we live in a world that tempts us to make false gods of riches and self-indulgence and to be indifferent to the needs of the poor. These "gods" aren't real; all they can promise are fleeting pleasures. By contrast, the one, true God loves us unconditionally and wants to save us and care for us. So follow Moses' advice and "fix in your heart" the truth that you belong to God—and he belongs to you (Deuteronomy 4:39)!

"Almighty God, Father, Son, and Spirit, may you be praised and worshipped for all eternity!"

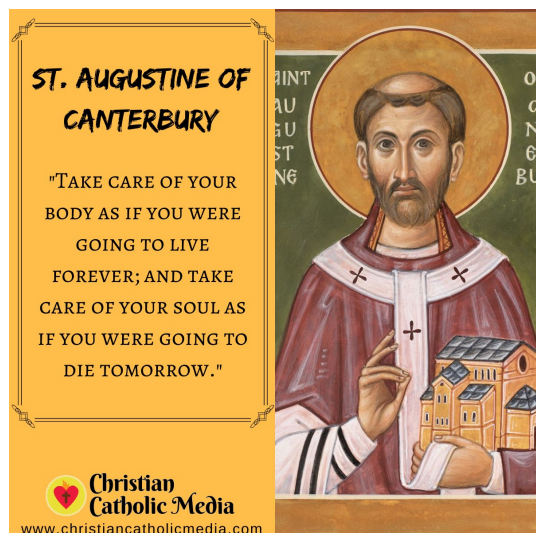
SAINT OF THE WEEK

SAINT AUGUSTINE OF CANTERBURY, BISHOP

Feast Day: May 27

C. Early Sixth Century–604

Patron Saint of England



Around the year 595, Pope Saint Gregory the Great was said to have been walking through a Roman market when he came upon some young boys being sold as slaves. Out of concern for them, he inquired where the boys were from. "Angles from the isle of England" he was told. "Ah, they are angels!" he exclaimed. Seeing these pagan boys being sold as slaves moved the pope to take action. He wanted them Christian, and he wanted all of Anglo-Saxon England to be Christian. But how?

The pope's first plan was to buy as many of the boys as possible, send them to monasteries where they could learn the Catholic faith, and if some were found worthy, ordain them as priests and send them back to their homeland to share the faith. However, this was a long-term plan, and the pope began to receive reports that the English were ready to convert if they only had missionaries to teach them the faith. Thus, the pope moved to plan B.

Shortly after our Lord's death and resurrection, the Roman Empire launched its conquest of Britain. As the Romans slowly accepted

Christianity, the faith trickled into pagan Britain, putting down deep roots after the empire legalized Christianity in the fourth century. After the Roman Empire fell, the Angles and Saxons conquered the Britons. With them came a return to pagan worship.


When Gregory became pope, Father Augustine was the abbey's prior. Pope Gregory asked the monks to become missionaries to Anglo-Saxon England. Father Augustine, who was advanced in age, was put in charge of the mission, and thirty to forty other monks traveled with him.

The monks' objective was to go to King Æthelberht of the Kingdom of Kent, in southeast England. King Æthelberht's wife, the daughter of Frankish King Charibert I, was a Christian who had been allowed to practice her faith freely. Encouraged by the pope, Abbot Augustine and the monks set out for the Kingdom of Kent. After the monks crossed the English Channel, King Æthelberht went out to meet them, welcoming them with open arms. He offered them a ruined church and gave them permission to convert as many people as they could. In less than a year, the king himself converted and was baptized. Elated with the news, Pope Gregory named Abbot Augustine as the first Archbishop of Canterbury. After receiving episcopal ordination in Arles, France, Archbishop Augustine returned to Kent and enthusiastically continued his mission. On Christmas Day 597, Archbishop Augustine baptized nearly 10,000 Anglo-Saxons.

For the next nine years, Archbishop Augustine worked tirelessly to establish the Church among the Anglo-Saxons. With the king's help, dioceses were created and many conversions followed. God performed so many miracles through Archbishop Augustine that the pope wrote to him, warning him not to allow those miracles to feed his pride.

After ten years of ministry in England, Archbishop Augustine knew his death was near. He prepared for his demise by choosing his successor and ordaining him a bishop. At the time of Augustine's death, two other kings had received baptism, and after his death, the missionary activity continued. By the end of the seventh century, after a series of ups and downs, the kings of each of the kingdoms of Anglo-Saxon England converted, and their people followed.

Saint Augustine of Canterbury, you were open to the will of God in your life, despite the radical and unexpected nature of your calling. You responded with courage, faith, and hope, and God used you in powerful ways. Please pray that I will respond to God's will with courage, so that I will share the faith God has given to me with others in accord with His holy will. Saint Augustine of Canterbury, pray for me. Jesus, I trust in You.
