What does the Word say to us today - the Fifth Sunday of Lent?

First Reading (Isaiah 43:16-21). The prophet assures the Jews exiled in Babylon that there will be a new Exodus. This message of hope should inspire us also.

Second Reading (Philippians 3:8-14). Paul has willingly sacrificed everything for the privilege of knowing Christ. He hasn't yet arrived but is still running the race of salvation.

Gospel (John 8:1-11). Jesus refuses to condemn a woman caught in adultery to death by stoning.

The aim of the Scribes and Pharisees was to set a snare for Jesus. If he pardoned the woman, he could be accused of encouraging people to break the law of Moses. If he agreed that she should be stoned, he would lose his name for mercy, but Jesus turned the tables on her accusers by suggesting that they look at their own sins. We see God's love and compassion in Jesus' treatment of the sinful woman.

Preparing for Holy Week 2022 Palm Sunday - next Sunday, 10 A pril

Holy Week is the week before Easter Sunday, beginning seven days before with Palm Sunday.


It ends with Holy Saturday. Easter is not part of Holy Week, but rather the beginning of the Easter season of the Liturgical year.

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday.

On this day, we celebrate the triumphant entry of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, into Jerusalem, riding a donkey. On that day, the people laid palms before Him, a gesture reserved for triumphant leaders.

We celebrate this at Mass by distributing palms to the faithful who may keep them for a time for use as devotional objects. The palms are blessed at Mass. Sometimes craft portions of palm fronds are crafted into crosses.

Eventually, these palms are returned to the Church where they are burned. Traditionally, their ashes are saved and distributed at next year's Ash Wednesday services.



Chrism Mass - Tuesday 12 April 2022

The Chrism Mass will be celebrated at 7.30pm on Tuesday 12 April at Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral, Waitara.

The priests of our Diocese gather for this celebration with Most Rev Bishop Anthony Randazzo to renew their priestly commitment. During Mass, the oils of Catechumens and the Sick are blessed, and the Chrism is consecrated and then taken back to each parish for use in various Sacramental liturgies throughout the year.

Parishioners are warmly invited to join together in this celebration and are most welcome to attend. There is no longer a capped number for attendance following the easing of COVID restrictions.
