## **Our Urgent Action is Required**

Earlier this week the Reproductive Care Reform Bill 2019 was tabled in the NSW Parliament. If passed, it will make abortion legal up until birth in NSW, for any reason, as long as two doctors agree if the baby is more than 22 weeks old. There has been no community consultation on this Bill. Attempts to rush the Bill through Parliament intentionally exclude the voices of all concerned citizens, including people of faith, from the debate.

The context in which the practice of abortion flourishes is complex and requires our careful attention. However, the killing of innocent life can hardly make us a more human society. It is a failure of social imagination and leadership not to commit to alternatives.

Please urgently contact our local member of the NSW Parliament and ask them to vote against this Bill. Our Local Member is Mr Alister Henskens. Phone Mr Henskens electoral office during business hours 9487 8588 and let them know that you are from the electorate and that you would ask he vote against the abortion bill.

- It would allow for abortion up until birth
- It does nothing to provide alternatives for women who feel they have "no other option."
- It overrides the conscience of doctors requiring them to refer to another doctor who will perform the abortion.
  - As Catholics we believe that women and children deserve better than an industry which kills life.

If you know a woman experiencing difficulty because of an unwanted pregnancy please know that there is help available. There are many Catholic agencies ready to assist.



## 50's And Over Singles Group Update

The recent outing with the above group on Sunday 28th July was a trip on the new Sydney Metro to Tallawong. We boarded the train at Chatswood Station and travelled to Tallawong where we changed trains and travelled to Rouse Hill. The Metro is a driverless train and it took about forty five minutes for the journey travelling at a speed of 100 kilometres per hour. The passengers sit on padded seats facing across each other on the sides of the carriage.





On arriving at Rouse Hill shopping centre we found a cafe and had morning tea. We then walked around the village like centre which has been well designed with many shops and narrow streets and courtyards with features such as fountains.

Later we had lunch at the Coffee Club and relaxed inside the cafe. When we had finished lunch we walked back to the Station and took the Metro back to Chatswood Station.

The next excursion for the above group is a trip to Dangar Island on the Hawkesbury River. We will meet at 9.00 am sharp at Hornsby Station on Friday 30th August 2019 and take the next train to Brooklyn. # Charítable Works Appeal 2019-2020



This week, we will be holding the first of the 3 mandatory CWF Appeals, for the new financial year. This service supported Patricia and her family and we will remember her on the fourth anniversary of her death (4 August 2015). The Charitable Works Fund is 100% tax deductible and 98.25 cents of every dollar goes to the following five beneficiaries:

- CatholicCare Hospital Chaplaincy and Pastoral Care Practitioner Program where 5 Pastoral Care Practitioners reach over 3,000 patients, 700 families and over 180 hospital staff each year across 7 hospitals in our Diocese.
- Confraternity of Christian Doctrine creating and updating the curriculum and training catechists who minister to public school students across the Diocese.
- St Lucy's School for primary school students with disabilities.
- St Edmund's School for secondary school students with disabilities.
