From Fr David

Upcoming Events

Dear friends,

Throughout our Season of Lent we are invited to consider the great pillars of spiritual practice—prayer, fasting and almsgiving—as means to make us more aware of both our need for God and for one another. In this way, Lent becomes a special time where we let go of our tendency to self-enclosure, and self-absorption, and open our hearts to others. In this spirit, through Lent we have many ways by which we become more aware of those less advantaged as ourselves.

Throughout Lent, the Church in Australia conducts an annual appeal called Project Compassion. This appeal assists the work of Caritas Australia, an international Catholic assistance organisation. Caritas responds, especially, in times of great tragedy and disaster.

Last week, as we do each year, we heard of the work of Cana Community (which began from our own parish many years ago). Cana reaches out to those who are homeless on the streets of Sydney, those with mental illness, those who have just been released from prison.

In the weeks ahead, we will hear a little more about the work of our own St Vincent de Paul Conference, a dedicated band of parishioners who each week provide assistance to people struggling in western Sydney, particularly those in Whalan. Our local Vinnies Conference, though, really needs your assistance. We are not sure that we will be able to continue this outreach into the future without new helpers coming forward to assist. This weekend, Mark and Louise Boffa, who have long dedicated themselves to the work of St Vincent de Paul Society, will speak to us about the significance of volunteering in general, and how enriching the time given can be both for ourselves and for the community at large. This is an involvement that might present especially as a way of drawing our young people into our parish community. Might you know of any young person who might be prepared to give up some hours of a Saturday morning to visit some of the families at Whalan who struggle with the ordinary needs of life? Over the next few weeks we will keep the work of our St Vincent de Paul Conference before us in the hope that new volunteers might come forward.

As many warmly appreciated we have developed a wonderful practice of morning tea after our 9.15am Mass. It is a tremendous occasion to talk to friends and it creates a great sense of community in our parish. We are currently needing some people or a family who might coordinate the morning tea for the second week of the month! Might you be able to assist?

Celebration of Reconciliation:


Choice of either 5.15pm or 6.30pm at church Tuesday 20th March or Wednesday 21st March.


