From Fr Paul

The first reading from The Book of Job confronts the problem of human suffering. Though Job is a good and just man, he suffers greatly. The common explanation was that suffering was a punishment for sin.

His suffering causes him to take a gloomy view of life, but ultimately his faith and hope prevail.

This sets the scene for the Gospel. However, what we see in the Gospel is not Jesus' answer to the question 'why suffering?', but his response to actual suffering. He heals the sick and proclaims the good news of salvation. The Gospel also shows the urgency with which he dedicated himself to preaching the Gospel, something we see exemplified also in St Paul (Second Reading).


Today's Gospel shows us how in the midst of all his work Jesus took time out to pray. Every Mass provides us with a great opportunity to take time out to be with the Lord. Today is an opportunity to ask: Do I have a regular discipline of prayer? Do I make time for stillness, silence and reflection? Do I take time to praise God, to express my gratitude and love, to pray about my life, those near me and the life of the world? As I approach Lent, how might I do more to show my love for God?

This week it was a joy and privilege for Deacon Sam, Fr Anselam and me to celebrate the beginning-of-year Mass for Prouille School and for St Edmund's school. On both occasions we reflected on what it might mean for each of these schools to be like a "city on the hilltop" in our local area — communities of faith, hope and love to which we are committed and which inspire others.

Our parish team met this week to pray and share together, and to look ahead to 2021. We reflected on Jesus' words to his apostles as he goes to his crucifixion: "I am the vine, you are the branches; cut off from me you can do nothing."

And again, from the psalm: "Unless the Lord build the city, in vain do the builders labour." Let's commit the life of our parish to the Lord, and rely on his grace and guidance.

"When I appealed to you, you would not listen to me. So I turned to my God and He heard my prayer...."


