From Fr David

Forthcoming Events

Dear friends,

We welcome back Fr Anselam after 3 weeks of annual leave! It is wonderful that he was able to enjoy good time with his mother and family and that the time way has been restful for him.

Given the continuing concern with the COVID-19 coronavirus, Bishop Anthony has instructed that the preventative measures he put in place at the end of January now stay in effect until the end of March-namely that the Chalice not be shared at Masses. However, given the escalation of concern in Sydney and throughout Australia he has now instructed that if the Sign of Peace is included at Mass, that the greeting not be by a handshake but rather by a nod or a smile. We will also keep the holy water fonts dry during this time. Bishop Anthony has not prevented people from receiving Communion on the tongue given that as much risk of human-human transmission of the virus is posed by a sweaty palm, and that the underlying risk remains in the gathering of people. However, certainly the Government advice to hand is not to advise against the gathering of people given that the risk of infection remains low. However, during this time it is important to maintain our own hygiene and not to present to gatherings if we are unwell. Throughout it is very important for us to maintain a sense of reason and balance and not to get drawn into irrational anxiety. The public reaction is interesting to observe, indeed. It is important that we go about our ordinary business in the normal manner until the advice is contrary.

Update on Davin and Sharon Ho

Sharon & Leanne now both at home. Davin still in rehab. All progressing well with recovery. Sharon has been home for a week now. Having Leanne and their parents for company. Both Sharon & Leanne are concentrating on scar management therapy. This involves a lot of constant care on the healing areas, applying cream, massaging the scars to smoothen them. They also need to continue with the exercises to strengthen their hands & fingers. They are having weekly consults with an occupational therapist to check on progress. Davin will continue staying at rehab for now. He has intense physio and OT sessions most weekday mornings and afternoon. Which leaves him quite tired. He still requires compression bandages for his hands & legs which get changed twice a week at RNSH. While staff at rehab can monitor and change (if necessary) the lighter bandages on the rest of the body. Leung got a day-pass over the weekend to spend Sat night at home. It's the first time in nearly 3 months that Leung, Sharon & the kids have been home together. For the better part of a day, they were able to enjoy a lazy weekend day at home, waking up in their own beds, eating medicine, doing laundry, eating medicine, watching a movie, eating medicine...

Keeping our Community Safe

Safeguarding is the term we use today to express our commitment to ensure that our community is a place of safety and care for all those in our parish, especially children and those who are vulnerable. These are the ways by which as a community we seek to do this. Our Parish seeks to fulfil the 10 Child Safety Standards introduced by the recent Royal Commission and not enshrine in the NSW Office of the Child Guardian With Diocesan support we comply with all legislation in respect to child safety All those who are in a child-related activity in the Parish require a validated NSW Working with Children Clearance Those who are visiting the elderly in their homes and those with financial responsibility in our Parish require a National Criminal History Check Our Clergy must attend a compulsory seminar in Safeguarding annually each year Any visiting clergy in our church must be identified in an audited Register and be cleared by the Diocese to do so Our Parish Staff must be inducted in Safeguarding and attend regular Safeguarding update seminars From 2020 we will be trained in Self-Assessment of Catholic Professional Standards Ltd Child Safety Standards, Criteria and Indicators; Our Parish Catechists are trained in Safeguarding We have literature on Safeguarding freely available at the entrance to our church We include Safeguarding material in induction packs for our volunteers We include Safeguarding material in our Baptismal Preparation packs and available for our parents enrolling their children at Prouille. Detailed information on Safeguarding exists on our Parish Website. We conduct the Sacrament of Reconciliation for Children in an open space, in line of sight of other adults We welcome parents to be in the Sacristy with their children who might be acting as Altar Servers. Before and after Masses, the sacristy doors should be completely open allowing total visibility from the "crying room" foyer; Parents are welcome also to accompany their children to Sunday morning Children's Liturgy We have refurbished our Confessionals to bring them into compliance with current standards and expectations We are to install security cameras in the Parish Sunroom so that the areas of our church are visible at all times For Parish functions using our beautiful garden space, we allocate two identifiable "Safeguarding Officers" to patrol the whole parish site to ensure the safety of our children at all times Remember: Our Children's Safety Belongs to All of Us!
