From Fr Paul

Dear Parishioners

Welcome to Holy Week 2022. A few points before I outline the key events of this Holy Week when we celebrate the highpoint of the Church's year.

This week I wrote to several of our most vulnerable, those who are very sick and housebound, assuring them the parish community prays for them and supports them. Fr Sam and I were very happy to return to Hammond Care at Turramurra to celebrate Mass with the Catholic residents. Again, we assured them they are part of our parish. They were very welcoming and enthusiastic to celebrate Mass again. We especially thank Trisha Lawrence and Brian McGarry for their wonderful involvement at Hammond Care.

Fr Sam and I joined the Prouille staff to wish them a happy Easter and a good break. We also farewelled and thanked Samantha Sheather, who has resigned as REC and is taking up a position with the Department of Education on the Central Coast. We also wished the students a happy Easter, encouraging them where possible to celebrate Easter with their families in the parish community. We wish all school students and staff in our parish a relaxing and good holiday in preparation for Term two. It was good to meet with our Catechists during the week. Thank you to Cecilia Kean (Co-ordinator) and to each of you for the great ministry bringing the Good News to children in our local state schools.

This coming Tuesday night all are welcome to attend the Chrism Mass at 7:30pm at OLOR Cathedral, Waitara. During this Mass, Bishop Anthony blesses the Holy Oils (of the Sick, of Catechumens and of Chrism) for the coming year and he leads the priests of the Diocese in a renewal of their priestly commitment made at Ordination. It was good to welcome Bishop Anthony, visiting priests and parishioners for the Penitential Service last Wednesday evening in preparation for easter.

Celebrating Holy Week

At the beginning of Holy Week each year, the Church invites us to welcome and accompany Christ as he enters the holy city of Jerusalem for the culmination of his earthly life and mission.

We commemorate the dark and glorious events of this week when "his hour" had come.

We gather as a community of faith, preparing to enter more deeply into the Paschal Mystery, that is, the Easter mystery of the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus.

On **Palm Sunday**, the Church commemorates Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. He comes in peace, symbolised by his riding on a donkey. People spread palm branches at Jesus' feet and called him "Hosanna" or "saviour." Palm branches were considered symbols of victory and triumph.

On **Holy Thursday,** the Church celebrates the two great commands of Jesus before his death: Jesus said as he instituted the Eucharist, the sacrament of his body and blood, **"Do this in memory of me".** After washing the disciples' feet, a sign of humble and loving service, Jesus said **"Do as I have done".**

On **Good Friday,** the Church marks the solemn celebration of the Lord's Passion. Jesus, a king despised and disfigured, the victim of an unjust system, symbolises in his state of abandonment, the degradation to which human beings can be reduced. Yet he remains all the while the 'man for others', surrendering to the Father's will.

On **Easter Sunday**, after a day of silent reflection, the Church rejoices in the Resurrection: "on the third day, he rose again." Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more. As his followers, "we look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come." This is the core of Christian faith.

I thank and acknowledge our musicians and all others who are preparing to help us celebrate Holy Week. It takes some planning and community effort to celebrate well. I encourage you to participate in the Easter ceremonies and Masses for Holy Week 2022.

May the peace and joy of our crucified and risen Saviour touch the hearts and lives on many in our troubled world this Easter. Be assured of my prayers and best wishes for a blessed and happy Easter. Fr Paul



The Chrism Mass will be celebrated at 7.30pm on Tuesday 12 April at Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral, Waitara.


