What does the Word say to us this Sunday?

First Reading (Wisdome 7:7-11). This is a passage in praise of wisdom, presented as a speech of Solomon.

Second Reading (Hebrews 4:12-13). God's word is effective and is a source of true wisdom for us.

Gospel (Mark 10:17-30). The case of a good young man who cannot follow Christ because he is unwilling to part with his wealth.

Wisdom teaches us how to live rightly, and enables us to use the things of this world in the way that will help us achieve the end for which God put us on earth. Wisdom, therefore, should be prized even more than gold (First Reading).

Today's Gospel is a discipleship story. The Jews believed that the prosperity of the rich was a sign of God's blessing, but Jesus presents wealth as a stumbling block to the kingdom. Love of material possessions & comforts is one of the chief obstacles in the way of discipleship. Those who trust in themselves and their possessions cannot surrender fully to the will of God.

When Jesus says, "Sell what you have..." he doesn't mean that a disciple must be destitute. The life of the poor, with its hardship and suffering, is not set forth in Mark's Gospel as an ideal for the Christian disciple, but neither is the desire for possessions and the accumulation of wealth.

SEVEN DEADLY SINS:

Bishop Robert Barron offers this presentation on the subject of the seven deadly sins, those great spiritual blocks that inhibit our flourishing in relationship with God and one another. Based on Dante's writings, the seven deadly sins correspond to the seven stories of Dante's Mt. Purgatory. Pride, envy, anger, sloth, gluttony, avarice and lust are all presented as patterns of dysfunction within us that lead to unhappiness.

Bishop Barron shows us how to counteract these seven sinful patterns through a conscious process of opposition, known as the "seven lively virtues." These offer antidotes to each sin and help set us on the right path to healing and happiness.

Saints we remember this week

Pope John XXIII 1881 - 1963

Feast Day - 11 October

*Saint John XXIII, original name **Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli**, (born November 25, 1881, Sotto il Monte, Italy—died June 3, 1963, Rome; beatified September 3, 2000; canonized April 27, 2014; feast day October 11), one of the most popular popes of all time (reigned 1958–63), who inaugurated a new era in the history of the Roman Catholic Church by his openness to change (aggiornamento), shown especially in his convoking of the Second Vatican Council. He wrote several socially important encyclicals, most notably *Pacem in Terris*.*

Feast Day - 15 October

Teresa of Ávila was a Spanish Carmelite nun who lived in the 1500s. She was a mystic and author of spiritual writings and poems. She reformed and founded numerous convents throughout Spain. She was the originator of the Carmelite Reform that restored a contemplative and austere life to the order.
