Dear friends,

With our schools now fully back, and with our Season of Lent beginning early this year, we now have the sense that the year is gathering momentum! This weekend, we introduce a range of resources that may be helpful to you to make this time of preparation for Easter as spiritually fruitful as possible. Do be sure to take some of them home with you, and consider how you might enter the Season of Lent before us in a way that will have most meaning for you.

As you can see, on each Friday in Lent every church in our Diocese will be open for prayer. This is part of an initiative called "The Light is ON" which began in the Archdiocese of Washington DC. On this first Friday of Lent, however, we will use this hour with a special Holy Hour in union with the whole Church of Australia in reparation for the crime s of sexual abuse that have occurred in our Church. The Bishops of Australia have invited us all to join in the prayer of reparation for this lamentable history over the days from Ash Wednesday to the First Sunday of Lent. From the week after, we will return to our annual practice of praying the Stations of the Cross each Friday evening.

Over four weeks of Lent, each Wednesday evening we are offering everyone the opportunity to come together for a meal at Prouiille School at 7pm, following the very successful formula we enjoyed through our Alpha Series last year. After our shared meal each evening, there will be a Lenten presentation and the opportunity for reflection in small groups. Do sign up on the page at the entrance to the church!

Given a diocesan matter I need to attend to on Saturday evening, Bishop Peter will celebrate our 5pm Mass. On Sunday evening, I have to travel to Brisbane to give some lectures at the Queensland Seminary on Monday and Tuesday morning. Our Carmelite friends will celebrate Mass on Sunday evening and Tuesday morning.

Our Parish Pastoral Council for 2018 meets this Tuesday evening to commence its work for the year. There will be much for us to consider, including the celebration of our 70th anniversary as a Parish, the Year of Youth being celebrated through the Church this year, and the ways in which our own Parish might contribute to the processes leading up to the 2020 Plenary of the Church in Australia. We look forward to being able to announce the Executive of our 2018 Parish Pastoral Council next weekend!

World Day of the Sick – 11 February 2018

The theme for this year's World Day of the Sick is: "Woman, behold your son ... Behold your mother. And from that hour the disciple took her into his home".

In his message for World Day of the Sick 2018, for Pope Francis puts before us the example of Mary, the mother of Jesus, as well as the disciple John. He says, 'Like Mary, the disciples are called to care for one another, but not only that. They know that Jesus'

heart is open to all and excludes no one. The Gospel of the Kingdom must be proclaimed to all, and the charity of Christians must be directed to all, simply because they are persons, children of God.' Pope Francis says, "The Lord's words brilliantly illuminate

the mystery of the Cross, which does not represent a hopeless tragedy, but rather the place where Jesus manifests his glory and shows his love to the end. That love in turn was to become the basis and rule for the Christian community and the life of each disciple. Before all else, Jesus' words are the source of Mary's

maternal vocation for all humanity. Mary was to be, in particular, the Mother of her Son's disciples, caring for them and their inumper through life." (Massage for World Day of the Sick 2018)



LENTEN PENANCE

Lent is a preparation for Easter, the focal point of the Church's liturgical year. As we prepare for the most important of the Christian feasts we are reminded of the love that God has shown in sending Jesus to us. Lent is a time of thanksgiving for what God has done for us. Jesus' announcement that the Kingdom of God had come was a proclamation of the divine intervention, which was intended to draw all humanity to a share in the divine life.

The preparation to receive the Kingdom is to repent: "Repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand." In the presence of Jesus, we are called to conversion. This is not just something that takes place once. Conversion is a continuing transformation of ourselves which opens us up more and more to God's presence in Jesus. Conversion is an ongoing reality in our lives.

We remember this especially at this time of Lent. Lent is a period in which we focus in a special way on turning our hearts towards God. To do this we must be ready to surrender ourselves. We need to find ways which are personally meaningful for us to bring about this surrender.

Friday 9 March is the celebration of **24 Hours for the Lord**. I ask parishes to have adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and the opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance as we join in solidarity with Pope Francis and the Universal Church. Another part of our penance could be to participate in **The Light is On** campaign.

Practices of penance are meant to help us to come to openness to God. They need to be educative, transforming us so that our hearts may turn more easily to God. The choice of Lenten penance is important. It is not just what we do; it is why we do it, and the effect that it has on our lives. Choose wisely and Lent can become a time of many graces and significant growth in our relationship with God.

DAYS OF PENANCE

Abstinence from meat and fasting are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

On all other Fridays of the year the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing any of the following:

- Prayer for example, Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to the church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the Stations of the Cross; praying the Rosary.
- b) Self-denial for example, not eating meat; not eating sweets or dessert; giving up entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor.
- Helping others for example, special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or overburdened.

All who have completed their eighteenth year and have not yet begun their sixtieth year are bound to fast. All who have completed their fourteenth year are bound to abstain.

In 2018, Lent lasts from Ash Wednesday (14 February) to The Mass of the Lord's Supper (29 March) inclusive. On Good Friday and, if possible also on Holy Saturday until the Easter Vigil, the Easter Fast is observed.

PASCHAL PRECEPT

Each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This is done between Ash Wednesday, 14 February and Trinity Sunday 27 May, unless for a good reason it is done at another time during the year. All of the faithful are obliged to confess their grave sins at least once a year.


There are now 5 seminarians attending the Good Shepherd Seminary for Broken Bay Diocese with the hope of a further 2 in the months ahead.
