AUSTRALIANS COMMEMORATE REMEMBRANCE DAY 2018 AND CENTENARY OF THE FIRST WORLD WAR ARMISTICE

All Australians are encouraged to pause on Remembrance Day 2018, the centenary of the First World War Armistice, and remember the men and women who have suffered and died in wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations Minister for Veterans' Affairs Darren Chester said Remembrance Day this year represented a significant chapter in Australia's military history, marking 100 years since the Armistice was signed, ending the fighting during the First World War. "On 11 November 1918 at 11 am, the guns on the Western Front fell silent and the most destructive war the modern world had seen was all but over and countries around the world celebrated," Mr Chester said. "But the war came at great cost to our young nation and of the some 416,000 who enlisted, more than 60,000 never returned home. It affected every community, large and small, across Australia. Remembrance Day is a time for us as a nation to unite in a minute of solemn respect and admiration for those who served and died in wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations."

We welcome everyone to place photos of their deceased relatives and friends for display during this coming November. The back of the framed photo (no larger than A4) should identify the deceased, together with the name and contact number of the contributor. The photos may be left at any stage during November in front of the lectern on the sanctuary. A Book of Remembrance is also available for us to record the names of those we would like to be remembered in prayer through the month of November. If you would like a Mass celebrated for the special intention of someone who has died, please fill out the details on one of the envelopes that are available at the entrances to the church. These can be left on any of the collection baskets or given to the Parish Office or Fr. David or Fr Anselam directly.

On each Friday evening through the Month of November Mass for the Deceased will be celebrated at 7pm., followed by Rosary.

Christmas is approaching, so that means that Carols in the Park is also approaching. In this age of increasing marginalising of the Christian church we have this great opportunity to present the real story of the birth of Jesus, the Saviour of the world to a largely unchurched audience. This year it is on Saturday 8th December 2018 at Bicentennial Park West Pymble and we have great program lined up. As in previous years we need help on the day for several different activities:

- Carols Choir. If you can hold a tune this is for you. All carols are in unison and you can have
 the music beforehand to look at. There will be three practices Sunday afternoon 18th
 November at 2:00pm at St Matthews West Pymble, Monday 26th November at 7:30pm at
 St Matts and Tuesday night 4th December at 7:30pm at Beecroft Community Centre with
 the Golden Kangaroos band.
- Volunteers to help pack our carols bags, which are key part of our fundraising activities; This takes place on Saturday 8 December about 8:30 to 11:30 in the morning at St Matts.
- Volunteers at the carols. This involves several activities before and during the carols, including crowd control, parking, selling carols bags counting people as they arrive as well as various other jobs. Volunteers need to be at the carols between about 4:00pm and the end of the carols. You will be fed. If we get enough volunteers then we should be able to split some of the shifts to suit people who can't be there all the time.
- The ages for choir members can be from primary school to.... if you can still sing! Ages for
 volunteers should be from about 15 years and up. Volunteers over 18 years of age need to
 have a Working with children check.
- The most important activity which everyone can take part in is to pray for fine weather, safety for all concerned, that technology will behave, for the artists and choirs and most of all that the Christmas story will be told clearly and that Jesus name will be glorified.
