### From Fr Paul

There is an old story (probably based on today's gospel) that one day Jesus came upon a shepherd overcome with sorrow. "Why are you so sad?" Jesus asked. "Because I've lost one of my sheep, and though I have looked all over for it, I have not found it; it may be that the wolves have already devoured it." To which Jesus said: "Wait here; I will look for the sheep myself." Some hours later Jesus returned with the sheep, and placing it at the shepherd's feet said: "From this day, you must love this sheep more than any other in your flock, for it was lost and now has been found." The point of today's Gospel is that every person is loved by God and that God seeks us. Let us be willing to repent and accept God's forgiveness, especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

#### Last week of preparation groups for Confirmation

This past four weeks 58 of our children have been preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation. I ask you to continue to pray for these children and for their families. We look forward to our practice session on the evening of 20th September, and then to the Confirmation ceremony on the evening of 22nd September, when Bishop Anthony Randazzo will join us. I thank Sally Oong for her coordination and organisation. I thank the group leaders (Dee, Geoff, Jacquie, Katie, Tomasz and Vanessa) who have instructed the children. I thank the Hanly family for providing the sausages for our sausage sizzle each week.

#### **Baptism and other Sacraments**

In recent weeks we have been preparing 18 older children (5–12 years) to be baptised. We wish these children (and their families) every blessing as the children receive this important sacrament. In Baptism, they are freed of sin, clothed in Christ and become members of his Church in the "community of the baptised". We continue to support the children from St Lucy's as they prepare for the Sacraments of Initiation.

#### Organ and Music ministry

As many of you know, some years ago an organ fund was established and the parish has sought to acquire a suitable organ to provide fitting music for our Liturgy and worship. I thank the members of the reference group whom I have asked to advise me. This week, on Thursday 15th September, we shall take delivery of an Allen's organ on trial, with no obligation or cost to the Parish. It will be set up in the transept of the church, in front of the Marian altar. Various organists have been invited to provide the music at upcoming Vigil and Sunday Masses.

# What does the Word of God say to us today - Year C Week 24?

First reading (Exodus 32:11, 13-14). Moses intercedes with God for the people because they have fallen into idolatry.

**Second reading (1 Timothy 1:12-17).** In his conversion, St Paul is a witness to the fact that Christ came into the world to save sinners.

Gospel (Luke 15:1-32). Through telling three parables Jesus justifies his concern for sinners.

The focus of all three readings is that of God's mercy towards sinners. In the **First Reading** we see that the people had abandoned God and fallen back into idolatry.

God's reaction portrays him as an angry, jealous God, who will resort to the most terrible punishments when his law is disobeyed, but that's not the message of the story. The message is that God pardons the sin of his people in response to the prayer of Moses.

In the **Gospel**, the fact that Jesus welcomed sinners and ate with them was a cause of scandal to the Pharisees. They, the 'separated ones', avoided all contact with sinners. They assumed that God has no dealing with sinners either, but Jesus shows them a very different kind of God. By means of three parables he justifies his concern for sinners. All three parables (of The Lost Sheep, The Lost Coin, The Lost Son) stress God's concern for the lost one, and his joy when a lost one is found.

To sin is to stray from God. Which of us can say that we have never strayed from God? But Jesus, the Good Shepherd, comes looking for us, and is overjoyed when he finds us.

In the Second Reading St Paul's conversion is proof of the fact that Christ came into the world to save sinners.


### What is the plan for mankind?

### Sacrament of Confirmation—Enrolling Now

*Eligibility:* Candidates must be Baptised and be eight years of age or older (Year 3 2022 minimum). In the Diocese of Broken Bay, Confirmation is celebrated prior to

Reconciliation and First Eucharist.

### Please note:

The candidate's Confirmation (Saint's) Name is recommended to be the name given to them at Baptism, if this is a Saint's Name. If not, please choose the name of a suitable, canonised Saint (see 2. below). 'Old Testament' people are not Saints. Please discuss this with Sally Oong if you require assistance with this choice. You can advise this name by August 22, if not yet decided.

The Saint's name should be of relevance to your child: eg Feast



day near their birthday, affinity with the Saint's life or their cause, their own name, or the name of person special to them. The website http://www.catholic.org/saints/ is a good place to start or there are many books on the Saints.

The Sponsor must be a practising Catholic, who is a fully-initiated member of the Catholic church (i.e. has completed their Sacraments, being Confirmation, Reconciliation and First Communion) and is over the age of 16. It is desirable that the Godparent at Baptism, if present, also be the Sponsor at Confirmation. A parent cannot be the sponsor. # We Remember this Week


### St John Chrysostom **(347 -407)** Feast Day - 13 September

Born in Antioch, c. 347, Saint John Chrysostom was perhaps the greatest preacher in the history of the Church, thus the name given him (Golden-mouthed), and the most prominent Greek Father of the Church.

He grew up in Antioch, received an excellent classical Greek education, and upon meeting the holy bishop Meletus, he decided to devote his time to the study of religious works and the Sacred Scriptures. He received Baptism after three years of study and set out for the desert to live the ascetic life of a hermit.

In fragile health, he returned to Antioch after two years of recovery, and devoted himself to studying for the priesthood. He was ordained in 386 and served in the Cathedral of Antioch for 12 years, winning widespread fame for his sublime preaching.

In 398, he was forcefully appointed Patriarch of Constantinople, and fast became very popular with his flock through his example of preaching and courage in front of the imperial power, whose corruption and decadence he never shirked from criticising in public.



This attitude naturally made an enemy of the empress, Eudoxia, as well as Theophilus, bishop of Alexandria, who had him condemned on false charges in 403. He was exiled to Armenia where he continued to be a great presence in the Church of the East through his many letters. He was exiled from Armenia to an isolated place along the Black Sea. He died during the journey in 407 in Pontus, his ill health unable to endure its rigors.

In 438 the Emperor Theodosius II of Constantinople had John's body returned to Constantinople, and did penance for the sins of his mother Eudoxia. Chrysostom is a Doctor of the Church and a great teacher of the Faith.

"Would you honour the body of Christ? Do not despise his nakedness; do not honour him here in church clothed in fine vestments and then pass him by unclothed and frozen outside. Remember that he who said, '*This is my Body*', and made good his words, also said, '*You saw me hungry and gave me no food*', and, '*in so far as you did it not to one of these, you did it not to me*'. " - **St. John Chrysostom**

### The Exaltation of the Holy Cross—Feast Day 14 September

In the Christian liturgical calendar, there are several different **Feasts of the Cross**, all of which commemorate the cross used in the crucifixion of Jesus. Unlike Good Friday, which is dedicated to the passion of Christ and the crucifixion, these feast days celebrate the cross itself, as the sign of salvation.

"We glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, for he is our salvation, our life and our resurrection; through him we are saved and made free." (Opening Antiphon: Liturgy for the Exaltation of the Cross)

An ancient prayer from the Church's Easter liturgy reads:

When Death and Life contended, the Lord of life was slain. A battle strangely ended: he won, and lives to reign. (Easter Sequence, VictimaePaschaliLaudes.)



Our Lady Of Sorrows—Feast Day 15 September

Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows became a standard devotion in the Church around the 14th century. It was revealed to St. Bridget of Sweden (1303-1373) that devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary's Seven Sorrows would bring great graces. The devotion consists in praying seven Hail Marys while meditating on the Seven Sorrows of Mary.

Mary, in a unique way, willingly suffered alongside her Divine Son as he gave his life to save the world, and she felt the bitterness of his passion as only a mother can. This devotion is especially remembered during September, the Month of Our Lady of Sorrows (the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows is 15th September ), and during the season of Lent.

The Seven Sorrows of Mary:

- 1. The Prophecy of Simeon (Luke 2:34-35)
- 2. The Flight into Egypt (Matthew 2:13-21)
- 3. The Loss of Jesus for Three Days (Luke 2:41-50)
- 4. The Carrying of the Cross (John 19:17)
- 5. The Crucifixion of Jesus (John 19:18-30)
- 6. Jesus Taken Down from the Cross (John 19:39-40)
- 7. Jesus Laid in the Tomb (John 19:39-42)
