What do the readings say to us this Sunday?

For this and the following two Sundays we will be reading from Luke's 'Sermon on the Plain' which parallels Matthew's 'Sermon on the Mount'.

The **First Reading** is some verses of wisdom poetry in Jeremiah (17:5-8). It contrasts the wicked who trust in the things of this world and the righteous who trust in God. The former are compared to a barren desert shrub; the latter to a fruitful tree planted beside a flowing river.

This prepares us for the **Gospel** (Luke 6:17, 20-26), where Jesus declares the poor blessed. The poor are the 'little ones' who have no one to trust in but God.

The beatitudes echo the programme Jesus announced in the synagogue at Nazareth. Whereas Matthew has nine Beatitudes, Luke has only four, with four corresponding 'woes'.

The **Second Reading** (1 Corinthians 15:12, 16-20) St Paul reminds us if Christ is not raised from the dead, our faith is in vain.

Our Morning Prayer is Changing!

Dear Parishioners of Holy Name,

Our daily morning prayer schedule is about to change. We have been discussing how we might create better opportunities for Eucharistic devotion and enrich our common prayer life as a community. As a result, we have decided to implement a new timetable for morning prayer on weekdays. It is as follows:

8:30AM - Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament

• Eucharistic adoration presents a wonderful opportunity to bring your hopes, joys, and sufferings before Our Lord in an intimate encounter. The practice of adoration is an ancient tradition that stretches back to the earliest years of the Church. Popes and Saints throughout the years have testified to its power to transform the human heart. Regular adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is a beautiful way to rejuvenate our prayer life and enter more deeply into a contemplative relationship with God.

"Every holy hour we make so pleases the Heart of Jesus that it will be recorded in Heaven and retold for all eternity. It opens up the floodgates of God's merciful Love upon the world." – St. Teresa of Calcutta

9:00AM – Recitation of the Liturgy of the Hours (Divine Office)

Morning Prayer is one part of the "Liturgy of the Hours," which is considered alongside the Mass as the official
public prayer of the Church. Its structure is based around the reading of the Psalms as Jesus would have prayed
daily, and is supplemented with a hymn, several antiphons, a short reading and some intercessions. It is led by
two cantors in the front pews of the Church (usually Fr Paul and Fr Sam), and the congregation on each side of the
Church take turns with them reciting each paragraph of the Psalms and responses. The whole prayer takes about
10 minutes and is very easy to learn and follow along.

If you would like join us in prayer, (at home or in the Church) the texts for Morning Prayer can be accessed through the app called "Universalis" available on both the <u>App Store (iPhone/iPad)</u> and the <u>Google Play Store (Android)</u>. We will also endeavour to make it visible on the screen in the Church.

We remember this week

Saints Cyril (825–869) and Methodius (826–884) Feast Day 14 February

Cyril and Methodius were brothers, born in Greece. Cyril, a philosopher, was ordained a priest. Methodius became a monk. In 861, the two brothers went as missionaries to Russia.

In 863, Cyril and Methodius were sent to Eastern Europe. They began translating the Gospels into the Slavic tongue. To do this, Cyril devised an alphabet that is still used in Russia and in some Slavic countries.

Cyril and Methodius ministered to the people as one. They celebrated Mass in Slavic. But some German bishops accused them of many things, so in 869, Cyril and Methodius were called to Rome to defend their actions. So well did they do this that not only were they told to continue preaching and using Slavic in the liturgy, but they were also to be consecrated bishops.

Cyril died before he could be consecrated bishop; Methodius was consecrated and returned to Eastern Europe. He was deposed by a German synod and imprisoned. Methodius was released two years later by the order of the Pope. Again, in 878, he was called to Rome to defend his actions, and again he was approved. For the rest of his life, Methodius endured the anger and misunderstanding of the German clergy.



May we be inspired by the faith and generosity of these two great saints.
