From Fr Paul

Last Sunday it was good to celebrate the feast day of Corpus Christi, one of the great feast days of the Catholic calendar. We celebrated the Vigil Mass as a **special family Mass** prepared by the Year Four boys and girls of the parish who received their First Holy Communion last year. Mass was followed by a sausage sizzle. It was great to see so many families and Prouille staff present to gather for the Eucharist and to enjoy one another's company over a meal.

You will recall that we ended Eastertide with the celebration of Pentecost Sunday, 23^{rd} May. That was followed by Trinity Sunday [30 May] and then Corpus Christi Sunday [6 June]. Today, we celebrate the 11^{th} Sunday in Ordinary Time and we will remain in **Ordinary Time** up until we end the Liturgical Year with the celebration of the Feast of Christ the King on Sunday, 21^{st} November.

Holy Name Church was filled with family, friends and parishioners to farewell Sam, to give thanks for his life and to pray for the repose of his soul. Readings and Reflections—11th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

A Summary of the Word for the 11th Sunday of Ordinary Time (Year B)

First Reading (Ezekiel 17:22-24): The prophet Ezekiel is writing during the Babylonian Exile (571BC), a time of great desolation. He foretold that God would take a twig from the top of the cedar and plant it on Mount Zion, in Jerusalem. Under God's protective power that twig would grow into a great cedar. Thus Ezekiel dreamed that God would transplant the exiled people of Israel back to the land of their ancestors. He glimpsed a future Son of David whose kingdom would be universal.

We see in the **Gospel (Mark 4:26-34)** the promise is fulfilled in Jesus, who ushers in the kingdom of God. The parables of the seed that grows by itself and the mustard seed were meant to encourage the early Church which was worried about the slow growth of the kingdom. They were telling the disciples to be patient, to trust, and not to expect instant results. Through the power of God, from small and insignificant beginnings the kingdom will grow into something great.

Second Reading (2 Corinthians 5:6-10) St Paul reminds us, as people of faith, our true home (in the body or out of the body) is to be with the Lord. We live by faith, full of confidence in Christ, who is our merciful and just judge.


