
Dear friends,

Thursday evening proved to be a very dramatic one in Hobart during the Mary Aikenhead Conference at which I spoke during the week! Outside the hotel, the roads turned into gushing streams. Thankfully, being on the 19th floor of the hotel, I was safe but we had some nervous moments wondering if I would be stranded in Hobart for the whole weekend! Fortunately, the weather had cleared by Friday afternoon to allow flights to resume.

This week we have the very special event of the visit of our Diocesan Year of Youth Cross. The context of the Cross is explained in the adjacent column. It is an important invitation for us especially to pray for the young people in our parish. Our Parish Pastoral Council has been reflecting on how we might assist the involvement of our young people in our community, and we are now exploring the possibility of some strategies particularly to focus on our young people in Years 5-8. We are hoping to be able to share some more news about this in the coming weeks.

Our deepest sympathy is extended to Candy Cosgriff, whose mother, Vera Priestly, has passed away in New Zealand. Sadly, Candy and Kevin are traveling though Europe at this time which makes things very difficult. We remember them all in our prayer.

Our warmest welcome to our children who begin their preparation this weekend to receive the Eucharist for the very first time in early June. We pray that this time will be a special one of friendship with the Lord and with the Church, the Sacrament of his Risen Body.

From 12 May to 18 May our Parish is hosting the Broken Bay Year of Youth Cross!

The cross was designed to be a simple contemporary design hoping that the richness of faith expression young people have will complement it. It was made from Tasmanian Oak, a eucalypt tree that grows in the south-east parts of Australia. It was chosen to represent the local Australian Church with its light colour representing the Light of Christ. This idea ties strongly to the symbolism used in our Diocese of the lighthouse. The timber has a range of grain structures and colours representing the many expressions of faith in the Diocese. On sharing photos of the cross with Bishop Peter, he asked if something could be added to signify the Crucified Christ. An abstract design was added using Purple Heart timber. This is a timber that comes from Central and South America, incidentally the location for the next WYD. This timber was chosen to represent the contribution and richness of people from all over the world to our local faith community. The colour represents mourning, pain and the crucifixion as well as the idea that Jesus was Priest, Prophet and King. Oil has been used as a finish to remind us of the oil used at baptism and anointing. The oil provides strength and protects the timber while bringing out the character of the wood. The stand for the Cross was made from discarded timber projects saved from a school skip bin. Despite being imperfect this timber now plays an important role in supporting the Cross. Despite all our flaws we are called to live faith filled lives, doing the work of Christ today. The cross is able to be taken apart in pieces to make transportation easier for its journey across Broken Bay in the Year of Youth.

The way the Year of Youth Cross has been embraced by the young people of our Diocese is a blessing and hope that it will inspire those who carry it in the future.

A Request from James and Jo Toomey

In June, Jo and I will be trekking 60km of the Larapinta Trail near Alice Springs to raise funds to launch a new urgently needed Mission Australia service in the Northern Territory called Missionbeat.

Missionbeat NT will be a life-saving mobile outreach and support service for young people experiencing homelessness or in need of assistance. You may be aware that Australia's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people endure disproportionate levels of homelessness and disadvantage, and I believe Missionbeat NT has an important role to play in addressing these issues. You may not be aware that the NT has the highest rate of homelessness in Australia.

As the CEO of Mission Australia, I've seen firsthand the impact Missionbeat has already made in Sydney, Brisbane, Perth and Tasmania, and I know its expansion to the NT will make a significant positive impact. Missionbeat staff aim to meet people's immediate needs, providing food, clothing, medical care and links to safe accommodation where possible. They also work in close collaboration with other organisations to help break the cycle of homelessness for individuals and families.

That's why I'm taking on this challenge – alongside my wife Jo and a number of other enthusiastic Mission Australia supporters – and why I'm asking for your help. I would be so grateful if you could support me and Jo with a donation. Every dollar you give will go directly towards launching Missionbeat in the NT as Jo and I have already covered the expenses associated with the trip. Your donation will be an investment into the lives and futures of vulnerable young Australians in desperate need.

Quotes from Pope Francís



"This holiness to which the Lord calls you will grow through small gestures. Here is an example: a woman goes shopping, she meets a neighbour and they begin to speak, and the gossip starts. But she says in her heart: "No, I will not speak badly of anyone". This is a step forward in holiness. Later, at home, one of her children wants to talk to her about his hopes and dreams, and even though she is tired, she sits down and listens with patience and love. That is another sacrifice that brings holiness. Later she experiences some anxiety, but recalling the love of the Virgin Mary, she takes her rosary and prays with faith. Yet another path of holiness. Later still, she goes out onto the street, encounters a poor person and stops to say a kind word to him. One more step." (*GE*, 16)



NSW Pastoral Ministry Conference - "Forming Missionary Disciples"

As part of my curiosity and media background I get emails from a variety of sources including the "Australian Catholic Council for Lay Pastoral Ministry" which is attached to the National bishops Conference as an advisory body to the "Bishops Commission for Church Ministry" <u>www.catholic.org.au/acclpm/home</u> They advertised this "NSW Pastoral Ministry Conference" and I decided to attend. My motivation was curiosity – what are other people doing? – and the opportunity to network. The conference on Tuesday May 1st 0930 till 1630 with optional Mass and Dinner to follow.

It was organised by the "Catholic Ministry Network NSW" which used to be called "NSW Association of Pastors, Pastoral Assistants and Parish Workers" (NAPPA). No wonder they changed the name! There were about 150 attending. They seemed to be mostly from Parramatta, Sydney, Wollongong, Maitland/Newcastle. The furthest was from Armidale. There was a keynote speaker and 12 workshops, interspersed by networking and discussion.

At the end we were asked to record our impressions which were talked about but not recorded by the conference. Mine were: There was a lot of rich and similar thought amongst the group(s). There was a lot of enthusiasm. There was much to be gained from hearing about how various parishes saw their ministry. The value of the Catholic Sacramental "system" was often mentioned as a treasure of which other Christian groups were jealous. This indicates that there is a fair bit of ecumenical sharing going on. A lot of energy was being focussed on youth. (There were quite a few RE teachers from schools attending). It is a challenge to absorb many of these facets and to redeploy them in the home parish situation. We in Wahroonga are doing well. The keynote speaker was Fr Paul Roberts who had been a High School teacher. He was ordained in 1993 (Parramatta). His first parish appointment coincided with the arrest and trial of the Priest in Charge. This was a baptism of fire for Fr Paul in many ways. He has also served as a missionary in a remote area of northern India and this has also shaped his attitude to the priesthood of the baptised. He is currently engaged in adult faith enrichment and parish ministry. He was very frank and inspiring.

My choices (2 out of 12) for the workshops were as follows:

*1 "Belonging and Believing – Small Groups as Catalysts for Renewal" The presenter was Jude Hennessy (Wollongong). They have made extensive use of "Alpha" and (like us) have heard the desire for "more of the same". So he has come up with a program called "Connect – a free Catholic resource for building Community *Faith Circles*". They provide free resources which are available online or in print. There seems to be a sheet available for every Sunday of the year based on the Gospel Reading. The format follows Alpha's: Food / Music / Reading / Sharing responses / small group discussion and prayer / Closing Prayer. Jude is a very energetic and motivated man. He has studied at various USA communities both Catholic and not (some similar to "Hillsong") but recognises the balance between education and inspiration. I have always been a believer in the power of small groups but he leaves me in the dust!!

*2 "Successful Engagement Program: Conversations about Catholics" I wasn't fully aware in advance of the nature of this workshop, but it was a great example of fostering the relationship between church and school. The presenters were Sr Alice Sullivan RSJ and Catherine Connor an REC in Bathurst. Sister Alice developed the idea in Mudgee and continues to use it in Bathurst. She realised that many parents brought their children to Catholic Schools, with very little knowledge or background in Catholic belief and practice. So she developed a friendly technique of bringing together small groups to tour the church, ask questions and have conversations with a cuppa. This helped people to cope with Catholic ideas and practices, to reduce shyness and increase confidence, to appreciate what their children were learning, to be able to talk about it at home and possibly come closer to the church themselves. Also to pray with their children. Sr Alice is a no-nonsense, forthright, caring person and her personality shines through the idea. They said that the program (in book form with other aids) is being used in various dioceses. I have no idea if it has reached Broken Bay, but it is a fine example of a gentle and welcoming evangelisation in the school context. I trust that our schools are doing similar things. The RECs in the group were very responsive to it.

At the end of the conference there were some words from Andrea Dean, Director, Office for the Participation of Women and Director, Lay Pastoral Ministry. (Bishops Commission). They hope to publish guidelines for Lay Pastoral Ministry soon.

Bishop Terry Brady (Sydney) showed a video by Bishop Tim Costelloe SDB (Perth) about the Church Plenary Council in Australia in 2020. He also distributed documents about this historic event and described quite frankly the tricky process of its development and eventual approval. It is the first such Church Council in any country of the world since Vatican II. There have been Synods. We will be hearing more about this and Bishop Brady was most insistent on personal contributions to the agenda of the Council!



I did not stay for the Mass and Dinner. There was only a small show of hands of those who intended to stay. And I needed to get home to keep tabs on the forthcoming birth of a new grandchild in Perth. She did arrive eventually the following afternoon.
