From Fr Paul

This Sunday concludes **National Vocation Awareness Week**. In the past week in my role as Vocations Director, along with my team of Fr Stephen Wayoyi and Michelle Chahine, we visited all 26 parishes across the Diocese to meet Priests and to distribute resources. This was an opportunity to celebrate the call of all the Baptised and to promote vocations to the Ordained Ministry and Consecrated Life. Where such a Vocation is concerned, God speaks, God calls: we do not choose, but discern, listen and obey, and in that, we will find our deepest happiness and fulfilment. Bishop Anthony Randazzo reminds us all of our Baptismal call and of the unique call which God makes to each of us. Bishop Anthony also encourages us to pray to the Lord for Vocations, to the Lord who is always calling.

Please note we are now calling for enrolment in the next celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation. (See page 4). The final Parent Information Night was held last Tuesday and we currently have 35 children enrolled and encourage parents of children 8 years and older to consider including their child/children in this Sacramental Program. We are also underway with preparing students from St Lucy's for the Sacraments of Confirmation, Reconciliation and First Communion.

Thanks to Fr Sunny and the Carmelite community at St Ives for their assistance with Masses last week and for their ongoing support. On Thursday and Friday of this week, Fr Sam and I concluded our Leadership Days with the Executives of the Broken Bay schools. This will assist Principals and School Executive to run similar days for their own staff and school communities. We have done this work at the request of Bishop Anthony and we wish to support him in his vision for our Catholic schools.

This Monday, 15th August we celebrate the **Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary**. This is a Holy Day of Obligation. We will celebrate **Mass at 7:00am, at 11:45am** (with Prouille Primary School Years 2-6 and the students from St Edmund's College) **and at 7:00pm**.

A Requiem Mass for the repose of Barbara Wing's soul will be offered on Monday, 15th August at 9:30am. Barbara and George have been parishioners of Holy Name since first attending on Christmas Day, 1958. Barbara was teacher/librarian at Prouille Primary School for many years. We extend our sympathy to George and their children, Margaret, Claire, Frances, David and Josephine. We pray for all families who are grieving at this time.

Please continue to pray for **John McGarry** who is very unwell following a stroke. John was very involved in the life of the HNW over the years, especially in serving at the Altar and as a Eucharistic Minister to the Sick. We continue to pray for all the sick and dying of the Parish, for God's peace and comfort in their suffering.

We have now begun a program for 15 older children (5-12 years) who are preparing for Baptism. We congratulate the Dowling, Leutogi, Grigor, Gonsalves and Natoli families who are having their children baptised this weekend. May they continue to make our Church a part of their lives.

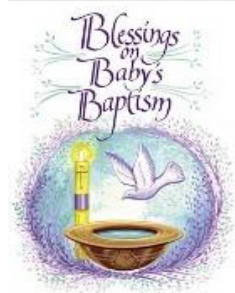

What does the Word of God say to us this Sunday – 20th Sunday Year C?

First reading (Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10). This describes the persecution of the prophet Jeremiah, whom Christians see as a pre-figuring of Christ.

Second reading (Hebrew 12:1-4). The author exhorts his readers to persevere in their faith, drawing strength from the example of Christ and all those who have gone before them.

Gospel (Luke 12:49-53). The coming of Christ marks a time of division in which people will be called on to declare their loyalties.

The **First Reading** describes the persecution of the prophet Jeremiah. Having tried in vain to save his people, Jeremiah was now abandoned to his enemies. Christians have always seen him as a figure of Christ. His sufferings remind us of the sufferings of Jesus, and his rescue from the pit reminds us of Jesus' resurrection from the tomb.

The **Gospel** contains two sayings about the nature of Jesus' mission. His coming marks a time for making decisions. His followers will have to make crucial choices; they will have to choose to be for him or against him. Choosing for him may divide them from family members. In the early Church, conversion was likely to cause family division. The convert often was rejected by the family, and had therefore to make a choice between Christ and family.

'Christians have the duty to proclaim the Gospel without excluding anyone. Instead of seeming to impose new obligations, they should appear as people who wish to share their joy, who point to a horizon of beauty and who invite others to a delicious banquet. Sacrament of Confirmation—Enrolling Now

Eligibility: Candidates must be Baptised and be eight years of age or older (Year 3 2022 minimum).

In the Diocese of Broken Bay, Confirmation is celebrated prior to Reconciliation and First Eucharist.

Enrolment: Please make a separate booking for each child, if more than one being registered for Confirmation, as you will be required to fill in the information for each candidate.

Please note:

- ◆ The candidate's Confirmation (Saint's) Name is recommended to be the name given to them at Baptism, if this is a Saint's Name. If not, please choose the name of a suitable, canonised Saint (see 2. below). 'Old Testament' people are not Saints. Please discuss this with Sally Oong if you require assistance with this choice. You can advise this name by August 22, if not yet decided.
- ◆ The Saint's name should be of relevance to your child: eg Feast day near their birthday, affinity with the Saint's life or their cause, their own name, or the name of person special to them. The website <http://www.catholic.org/saints/> is a good place to start or there are many books on the Saints.
- ◆ The Sponsor must be a practising Catholic, who is a fully-initiated member of the Catholic church (i.e. has completed their Sacraments, being Confirmation, Reconciliation and First Communion) and is over the age of 16. It is desirable that the Godparent at Baptism, if present, also be the Sponsor at Confirmation. A parent cannot be the sponsor. An adult may 'stand-in' on the day for the Sponsor, e.g. if the Godparent cannot attend. If you wish to discuss any of the above, please contact Sally Oong at sally.oong@bbcatholic.org.au

The Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Monday, 15th August

On November 1st 1950, Pope Pius XII defined as a dogma revealed by God and therefore as of divine and Catholic faith "that the Immaculate Mother of God, Mary ever Virgin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven." (DS 3903; see LG n.59 and Catechism of the Catholic Church n.966).

The importance of the expression "**body and soul**" is to insist that the whole of Mary's humanity - all that it means to be a human person - is transformed by grace and enjoying the fullness of life in communion with God. She is not some kind of disembodied soul awaiting the resurrection. Through God's loving grace and because of her union with her Son, she is enjoying now the complete human communion with God which is the goal of every person's existence, and for which we all long.

St Paul says: The wages of sin is death. We recognise Mary as "full of grace", free of Original Sin and without sin in her entire life. As the sinless one, and Mother of the incarnate Word, it is only right that, when the course of her earthly life had ended, she would be assumed, body and soul, into communion with God.

The Second Vatican Council reminds us that: "In Mary the Church ... joyfully contemplates, as in a faultless image, that which she herself desires and hopes wholly to be"(SC n.103). And, with special reference to the Assumption, the same Council states: "The Mother of Jesus in the glory which she possesses in body and soul in heaven is ... a sign of certain hope and comfort to the pilgrim people of God"(LG.n.68). As the Catholic Catechism states: "The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the Resurrection of all Christians"(n.966).

At the same Council, the bishops wrote in "The Dogmatic Constitution on the Church" that Mary's Assumption offers both a **reminder and hope** of the bodily resurrection of all people at the end of time (Catechism of the Catholic Church 366) and comfort now for those grieving the death of a loved one:

"In the bodily and spiritual glory which she possesses in heaven, the Mother of Jesus continues in this present world as the image and the first flowering of the Church as she [the Church] is to be perfected in the world to come. Likewise, Mary shines forth on earth, until the day of the Lord shall come (cf. 2 Peter 3:10), as a sign on sure hope and solace for the pilgrim People of God." (No. 68)

The Praises of Mary - "Assumption"

Poem by Saint Anthony of Padua (1195-1231) Doctor of the Church

**O how wondrous is the dignity of the glorious Virgin!
She merited to become the mother of Him who is the strength
and beauty of the angels and the grandeur of all the saints.**

**Mary was the seat of our sanctification, that is to say,
the dwelling place of the Son who sacrificed Himself for us.**

**"And I shall glorify the place where my feet have stood."
The feet of the Saviour signify His human nature.
The place where the feet of the Saviour stood was the
Blessed Mary, who gave Him His human nature.**

**Today the Lord glorifies that place, since He has exalted Mary
above the choirs of the angels. That is to say, the
Blessed Virgin, who was the dwelling of the
Saviour, has been assumed bodily into heaven.**

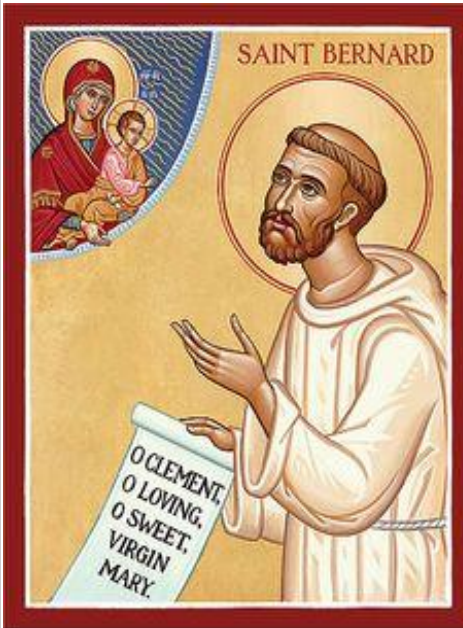

Saints We Remember this Week

St Bernard (1090 - 1153) - Feast Day 20 August



St. Bernard of Clairvaux, is a Doctor of the Church thanks to his writings and sermons which greatly influenced Europe during the 12th century.

Bernard spent his early years near Dijon, France before leaving to joining the Cistercians at the age of 22. He was well educated and so passionate about his faith that he convinced his brothers, his uncle, and many of his friends to join him at the abbey. Three years later he was sent with 12 other monks to establish another monastery in the Diocese of Champagne. The monastery came to be known Clairvaux (Valley of Light). He led the other monks there as the Abbot for the rest of his life.

St. Bernard knew how to harmonise the contemplative life with important missionary work. However, the saint's strict observance of silence and contemplation did not impede him from living a very intense apostolic life. His humility and his commitment to tame his impetuous temperament were exemplary.

St Bernard focused on the truth that God, who is love, created humankind out of love and that man's salvation consists of adhering firmly to Divine love, revealed through the crucified and risen Christ.

"The richness of St. Bernard's preaching and his theology were not in pursuing new paths," Pope Benedict XVI said, "but in succeeding to propose the truth of the faith in a clear and incisive way so as to fascinate the listener and lead the person to prayer."

St. Bernard is also well-known for his Marian devotion, especially in using and promoting the "Memorare" prayer. He became widely known throughout Europe and was consulted by Popes and political leaders. He was canonised in 1174.

In August 2008, Pope Benedict spoke of the saint during his weekly general audience. He recalled that Pope Pius VIII labelled the "Honey-Sweet Doctor" for his eloquence and that he travelled throughout Europe defending the Christian faith. Benedict XVI added, "He was also remembered as a Doctor of Mariology, not because he wrote extensively on Our Lady, but because he understood her essential role in the Church, presenting her as the perfect model of the monastic life and of every other form of the Christian life."

St Pius X (02.06.1835 – 20.08.1914)

Feast Day 21 August

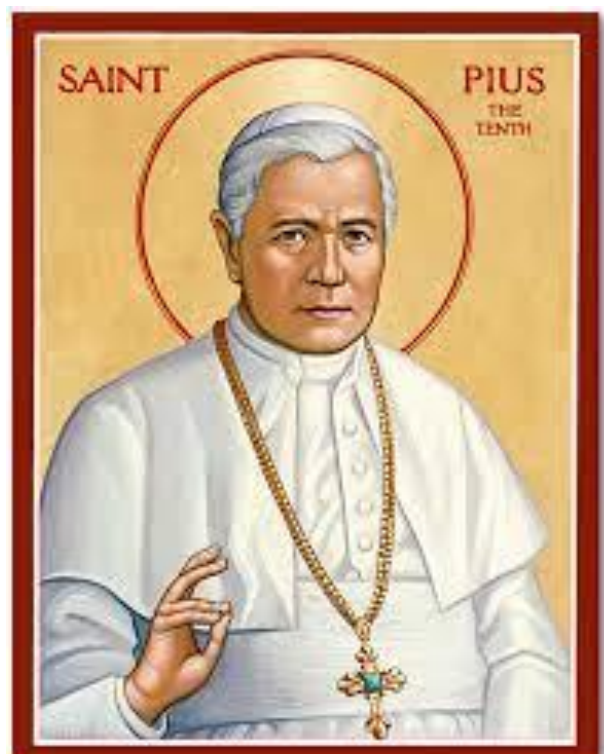
Giuseppe Melchiorre Sarto, nicknamed "Bepi" by his family, was born on June 2, 1835 in Riese, Italy, a farming village near Venice. He was the oldest of nine children. We know him today as Pope Saint Pius X.

When he was 11 years old, he told his father that he wanted to become a priest. Giuseppe graduated first in his high school class at the age of 15 and immediately entered the seminary in Padua. He graduated from the seminary first in his class in 1858 and was ordained a priest. He was devoted to the Eucharist, enjoyed preaching and loved young people.

He was named Cardinal and Patriarch (Archbishop) of Venice in 1893, and he was elected Pope on August 4, 1903.

He is often called the Pope of the Eucharist because he made Holy Communion available to younger people "at the age of reason".

Pius X died on August 20, 1914, in Rome, Italy. He was canonised as a saint on May 29, 1954. His feast day is celebrated on August 21.
