

# From Fr Paul

Dear Parishioners,

Just two months ago I began here at Holy Name, Wahroonga. It has been a time of becoming familiar with you the people and the culture of the parish, knowing the roles of parish team members, meeting various ministry and group leaders, visiting and ministering to the schools within the Parish boundaries, and becoming familiar with the hospitals and aged care facilities. I have sought to make the ongoing celebration of the sacraments and Liturgy my initial focus, along with the beginning-of-school-year and the Lenten season. We have established a regular Holy Hour (8-9am) to begin the day prior to Morning Mass. Much of this I have shared with Fr Anselam and Deacon Sam.

Fr Anselam, Deacon Sam and I had some hours at St Lucy's School during the week. It was an opportunity to visit several classes, meet with the Principal (David Raphael) and the REC (Vanessa Dillon), and gain a sense of the history, current operations and plans for the school's ongoing development. David and Vanessa expressed their appreciation that the school has a close connection with the Holy Name community. It is our privilege to serve these children with special needs, and their families. Of the "little ones" Jesus said, "to such as these does the kingdom of heaven belong".

I have met with the Parish Finance Committee (PFC) reviewing our financial position, checking revenue and expenditure during the Covid period. A report is being prepared for the parish. According to Canon Law and diocesan guidelines, a new Parish Priest is to establish a new Parish Finance Committee, not excluding members of the previous Committee, within three (3) months of taking office. I shall continue to work with the current committee and address changes to the PFC during the year.

This week there was a Change of Parish Priest Review. The Review covered the Finance and Accounting areas and the Operations and Administration areas of the Parish. I shall make the findings known to the PFC and PPMC.

This week I have met with Gemma McDermott, Chair of the Parish Pastoral and Missionary Council (PPMC) to be briefed about the work and vision of the current PPMC. We shall have our first meeting on 22nd March. I shall endeavour to make the vision and workings of the PPMC as transparent and accessible as possible to the parish community.

Wishing you a blessed week as we continue our preparation for the great solemnity of Easter. Fr Paul



Holy Hour, Reconciliation and Stations - Friday evenings from 6:00pm

Stations will be prayed in the Church each Friday evening during Lent at 7.00pm. All are welcome. Holy Hour from 6:00pm, concluding with Benediction. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available during this time.

Second Rite of Reconciliation in Preparation for Easter
We gather together to prepare and then there is the opportunity for individual Reconciliation.
This Wednesday evening, 17th March, 7.30pm
(We will have 3 visiting priests assisting)

Pope Francis has encouraged all the faithful to return to the practice of regular Confession (the Sacrament of Reconciliation). The Code of Canon Law states: After having reached the age of discretion, each member of the faithful is obliged to confess faithfully his or her grave sins at least once a year. (CIC 989) That said, "it is recommended to the Christian faithful that they also confess venial sins" (CIC 988). This sacrament is a celebration of the mercy and forgiveness of God, gifts which we must actively receive.

# Blessings in regular Confession in the Sacrament of Reconciliation

There are many blessings in regular confession (cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church 1425-1498).

Among such blessings are the following:

- It restores divine life if I have lost it through mortal or serious sin.
- It increases grace and my capacity for grace, and helps me to grow in Christian maturity.
- It brings order and peace into my life by causing me to pause at regular intervals and ask myself the all-important question: Where am I in my relationship with God?
- It improves personal relations with others by making me aware of attitudes and actions that cause pain to other, and keep me in a state of alienation from God and others.
- It motivates me to practise the essential Christian virtues: faith, hope, charity, humility, self-denial, repentance, detachment from the ways of modern life which lead me away from God.

Making a good Confession entails contrition (sincere sorrow for offending God), confession of sin (confronting our sinfuness in an honest manner) and satisfaction (making amends by following the priest's advice and doing the penance he gives). A good Confession requires of me preparation by prayer, examining my conscience and the making the resolve to try not to sin again.



# This Week's Readings and Reflection

First Reading: 2 Chron 36: 14-16.19-23

Because of their sins God allowed his people to be exiled to Babylon. But his mercy is seen in their home-coming.

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 136

Let my tongue be silenced, if I ever forget you!

Second Reading: Eph 2:4-10

It is not through our own efforts that we are saved, but through the love and mercy of God.

#### Reflection

The First Reading shows how God remained faithful to his people in spite of their infidelities. God's promises were not nullified by the sins of his people. It was because of their sins that God allowed his people to be exiled to Babylon, but his mercy is seen in their home-coming.

This leads into the Gospel. God's love and mercy are seen in the fact that he sent his Son to save us. Jesus came into the world as a light. Sadly, some preferred darkness to light, thus sealing their own condemnation. Judgement is not passed by God; people judge themselves by their response to the light.

The reading from Ephesians stresses the enormity of the love God has shown us in Christ. It makes it clear that we owe our salvation, not to our own efforts, but to the goodness of God.

## Reflection:

First Reading (2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23) shows how God remained faithful to his people in spite of their infidelities. God's promises were not nullified by the sins of his people.

Second Reading (Ephesians 2:4-10) stresses the enormity of the love God has shown us in Christ. It makes it clear that we owe our salvation, not to our own efforts, but to the goodness of God.

Gospel (John 3:14-21) In his love for us, God sent his Son into the world, not to condemn us, but to save us.

`God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life.' We hear these marvelous words in today's Gospel. They are a summary of the Good News.

Mercy is the Lord's most powerful message.

It is not easy to trust oneself to the mercy of God - but we must do it.

From Jesus, we will not hear words of contempt or condemnation, but only words of love, of mercy, that invite us to conversion.


