Dear friends,

It's been called the art of precious scars. The Japanese practice of *Kintsugi* (meaning 'golden joined' or 'golden repair') is both a technique and a philosophy of life. It involves repairing broken cups and plates by filling the cracks with gold. Misfortune becomes good fortune as the original item is transformed into a valuable work of art. Rather than hide the scars, it highlights them and makes them a feature of newfound beauty.



In the gospel of St. John the week it is Thomas called the 'Twin' who asks to see and touch the scars of Jesus, so that he may believe in His resurrection from the dead. The scars of Jesus are like the *Kintsugi* repair which highlights the scars as precious and a source of healing for us all.

What do the Readings say to us this Sunday - Second Sunday of Easter—Divine Mercy Sunday

First Reading: Acts 2:42-47 The faithful lived together and owned everything in common.

Second Reading: 1 Pet 1:3-9: He has given us a new birth as his children, by raising Jesus Christ from the dead...

Gospel: **Jn 20:19-31** After eight days Jesus came in and stood among them.

Divine Mercy Sunday - Second Sunday of Easter 16th April, 2023

In February 1931, Jesus appeared to a humble nun, Sr Maria Faustina Kowalska, in Poland. He appeared as the 'King of Divine Mercy', wearing a white garment, with rays of white and red light shining from his heart. He told her to paint his image, with the words: 'Jesus, I trust in You'. He said he wanted this image venerated, first in her chapel, and then throughout the world. He promised that anyone who venerates this image will not perish.



Divine Mercy is at the heart of the Gospel and of the Paschal (Easter) Mystery. Celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday honours Jesus' request to St Faustina (Diary, n 699), and also re-claims the early church practice of naming the Easter Octave as "the days of divine mercy and pardon".

What is the Divine Mercy message in a nutshell? To quote from the Diary of St Faustina:

Ask God for His Mercy - "...be willing to talk openly with your God of Mercy who wants to speak words of pardon and lavish his graces on you." Diary #1485 and " ... Do not lose heart coming for pardon, for I am always ready to forgive you. As often as you beg for it, you glorify My mercy." Diary #1488;

Be merciful to others - The Merciful shall be shown Mercy ... "three ways of exercising mercy - by deed, by word, by prayer. In these three degrees is contained the fullness of mercy..." Diary # 742; and

Trust in Jesus completely - "... if your trust is great, then my generosity will be without limit." Diary #548 and "...Your great trust in Me forces Me to continuously grant you graces ..." Diary #718.
