Dear friends,

Fr Anselam contacted me during the week to say that he had arrived safely to his mother's home in India! We continue to pray that he will enjoy a wonderful time with his family and have a great holiday.

Last Tuesday, 11 February was the feast-day of Our Lady of Lourdes. It is the day marked also as the 28th World Day of the Sick 2020. Pope Francis gives us a timely message for this occasion: "Jesus does not make demands of those who endure situations of frailty, suffering and weakness, but offers his mercy and his comforting presence. He looks upon wounded humanity with eyes that gaze into the heart of each person. That gaze is not one of indifference; rather it embraces people in their entirety, each person in his or her health condition, discarding no one, but rather inviting everyone to share in his life and to experience his tender love. . . [And so] what is needed is a personalised approach to the sick, not just of curing but also of caring, in view of an integral human healing . . . In a word, love." This is what motivates our own parish ministry to the sick. Do give some thought to this weekend's invitation to become a part of this grace-filled outreach.

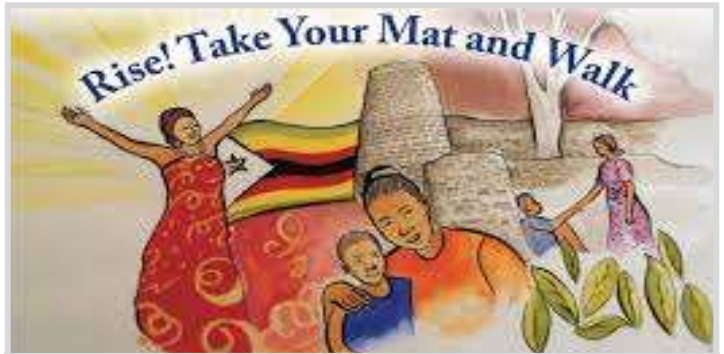

The WDP 2020 program is based on Jesus' encounter with a person who, although positioned for healing, had not acted upon the opportunities given. Jesus asked – "Do you want to be made well?" You are faced with this life-changing question. What are you going to do? "Rise! Take Your Mat and Walk," said Jesus. Our sisters from Zimbabwe are taking Jesus' encounter to be a call to act in love for peace and reconciliation. "The action verbs suggest that we should not be afraid to act on the word of God. God is offering us the steps for personal and social transformation." We are empowered to take up our mats. No more waiting powerlessly on the mat. As expressed in the WDP 2020 painting by Nonhlanhla Mathe, let us give a healing hand to the needy, let us embrace children with love as their future is ahead, and let us open our arms in joy as the time to rise up has come. This is the time for change!

The World Day of Prayer is a global ecumenical movement led by Christian women who welcome you to join in prayer and action for peace and justice. It is run under the motto "Informed Prayer and Prayerful Action," and is celebrated annually in over 170 countries on the first Friday in March. The movement aims to bring together people of various races, cultures and traditions in a yearly common Day of Prayer, as well as in closer fellowship, understanding and action throughout the year.

Our Parish Participation in the journey towards the Plenary Council of 2020-2021

Through the "Listening Phase" of the journey towards the Plenary Council which opens in October 2019, six themes emerged for consideration in the current "Discernment Phase." The six themes are about a Christ-centred Church which is

- Missionary and evangelising
- Inclusive, participatory and synodal
- Prayerful and Eucharistic
- Humble, healing and merciful
- A joyful, hope filled and servant community
- Open to conversion, renewal and reform

You will see posters reflecting these themes on the wall of our church.

**This year, we will take these themes and ask,
"What might these mean for us a parish community?"**

We propose to do this in several ways:

- **During Lent** we will invite our community to **pray** these themes. On each of the six Thursdays of Lent we will invite our parishioners to come together for a meal at Prouille followed by a guided prayer and faith reflection on each theme;
- **In the second half of the year** we will stage a facilitated process of six parish forums, each on a theme, discussing how the theme might be realised in our own context. The outcomes of the forums will be at the service of developing a 3 year strategic pastoral plan for our community.

An Update on Davin and Sharon Ho As they continue to progress in recovery from the White Island Volcano Tragedy

11 days since being readmitted into the burns unit at RNSH, Davin has again been moved out to a rehab centre at Eastwood. They have a proper rehab facility for burns victims, so hopefully it'll be good for Davin as they will put him through the relevant exercises and therapy. There is still some slight swelling in his arms and legs, which are being treated with compression bandages. His wounds continue to heal at different rates. Lower back still causing a few issues with wounds opening up and seeping occasionally. But overall, doctors are happy with the progress. Throughout all this, Davin has been getting stronger and not complained at all.

Sharon is still at Mt Wilga Rehab, but preparing to go home. As exciting as it will be to be able to go home, it is still a daunting thought to go home and start relearning how to do everything. Sharon is improving very well. Her mobility is so much better. Being able to curl her fingers quite fully. Walking around quite freely. Both her and Leanne are concentrating very hard on scar therapy. Compression gloves. Funky headwear. Lots of massaging.

Leanne has been home for 18 days now. She will be a great help to Sharon when she comes home. Having experienced all the difficulties of being out on her own.

SRE School Teacher Ku-ring-gai High School (Part time)

Ku-ring-gai Christian Education Association Inc (KCEA) is an ecumenical association seeking to appoint an SRE Teacher to deliver a regular SRE program to students in years 7-10, and potentially to co-ordinate seminars for years 11-12. The position commences Term 1 2020 and has an anticipated three to four day a week workload.

KCEA invites applicants who have demonstrated experience in teaching, building relationships, and an enthusiasm for working with young people and a passion for sharing the good news of Jesus Christ in a professional classroom setting. The successful applicant will be experienced using current teaching methodology including technology in the classroom.

The position includes classroom SRE teaching, co-ordinating and leading a lunchtime student group and other groups or activities as the role develops. The applicant may also have additional skills or abilities that could be useful in other school activities, by agreement with the school and committee. The role will also include preparation and editing of the KCEA quarterly newsletter, ongoing liaison with and reporting to the committee, and attendance at committee meetings and supporter breakfasts.

KCEA teaches an ecumenical SRE curriculum. The delivery focuses on inclusivity of all students no matter what their belief or cultural background, whilst sharing a Christian perspective.

The applicant will have obtained or is actively pursuing a Theological qualification from an approved institution, and a formal teaching qualification is preferred. Salary will be paid in accordance with qualifications and experience, with the NSW Dept of Education pay scales to be used as a guide of salary.

Keeping our Community Safe

Safeguarding is the term we use today to express our commitment to ensure that our community is a place of safety and care for all those in our parish, especially children and those who are vulnerable.

These are the ways by which as a community we seek to do this.

- Our Parish seeks to fulfil the 10 Child Safety Standards introduced by the recent Royal Commission and not enshrine in the NSW Office of the Child Guardian
- With Diocesan support we comply with all legislation in respect to child safety
- All those who are in a child-related activity in the Parish require a validated NSW Working with Children Clearance
- Those who are visiting the elderly in their homes and those with financial responsibility in our Parish require a National Criminal History Check
- Our Clergy must attend a compulsory seminar in Safeguarding annually each year
- Any visiting clergy in our church must be identified in an audited Register and be cleared by the Diocese to do so
- Our Parish Staff must be inducted in Safeguarding and attend regular Safeguarding update seminars
- From 2020 we will be trained in Self-Assessment of Catholic Professional Standards Ltd Child Safety Standards, Criteria and Indicators;
- Our Parish Catechists are trained in Safeguarding
- We have literature on Safeguarding freely available at the entrance to our church
- We include Safeguarding material in induction packs for our volunteers
- We include Safeguarding material in our Baptismal Preparation packs and available for our parents enrolling their children at Prouille.
- Detailed information on Safeguarding exists on our Parish Website.
- We conduct the Sacrament of Reconciliation for Children in an open space, in line of sight of other adults
- We welcome parents to be in the Sacristy with their children who might be acting as Altar Servers.
- Before and after Masses, the sacristy doors should be completely open allowing total visibility from the "crying room" foyer;
- Parents are welcome also to accompany their children to Sunday morning Children's Liturgy
- We have refurbished our Confessionals to bring them into compliance with current standards and expectations
- We are to install security cameras in the Parish Sunroom so that the areas of our church are visible at all times
- For Parish functions using our beautiful garden space, we allocate two identifiable "Safeguarding Officers" to patrol the whole parish site to ensure the safety of our children at all times
