Dear friends,

The Diocese of Broken Bay is sending 167 pilgrims to World Youth Day on 21st July to Lisbon, in Portugal. There they will meet with Pope Francis who will celebrate the final Mass for young people from throughout the world who meet in Lisbon for a week long experience of prayer, song and catechesis.

The 42 leaders of the group will comprise Bishop Anthony Randazzo, Fr. Sam French, along with chaplains, Seminarians and teachers from Catholic schools. The group will join other young Australians from the Dioceses of Sydney, Parramatta and Townsville.

The theme of WYD, chosen by Pope Francis is: 'Mary arose and went with haste.' (Lk 1:39). This account tells of the Visitation of Mary to her cousin Elizabeth. Let us pray for our young people and leaders during this time of encounter with the Lord, and pray that they will convey the spirit of WYD to the communities of the Diocese of Broken Bay upon their return.

Although its Catholic identity is clearly evident, WYD opens its doors to everyone, no matter how close to or distant from the Church they are. The World Youth Day was instituted by Pope St John Paul II, following the success of a youth Gathering in Rome in 1984. The first Official WYD then occurred in 1986.

What happens at WYD?

Over the course of a week, young people from all over the world are welcomed, mainly in public (gymnasiums, schools, pavilions ...) and parish facilities or family homes. In addition to the moments of prayer, sharing and leisure, the young people enrolled in this celebration participate in various initiatives organized by the WYD team, in different locations across the host city. The highlights are the celebrations (central features) for which the Pope is present, such as the welcoming and opening ceremony, the Way of the Cross, the vigil and, on the last day, the closing mass.

Urgent Request: "Many hands to make light work. We have lovely ladies who have been volunteering cleaning the Church for many years. Now the time has come for them to step down and let some of the younger ones take over. If we could recruit a good number of helpers (both women and men), it may only mean a few hours a month is necessary.

It would be great if we could find someone to at least initially clean the brass on the doors of the Church just to make the brass shiny and presentable. Only the brass plate would need to be done, as the filigree pattern on the brass plate looks fine at the moment and would just need a good wipe-over for the next few weeks. Obviously, there is much more to do, but doing the brass doors makes the Church seem more welcoming.

Another thing we are conscious of is the candle stand. We like to clean the touch knobs (which light the candle), as it helps to keep them more hygienic after many uses. This only needs a clean cloth to dry-wipe along the touch knobs thoroughly – it only takes a couple of minutes to do.

The current ladies are more than willing to explain to anyone who is interested in taking on a cleaning role what is involved and any other things that need doing. They are happy to work with them for a couple of weeks giving training.

Please consider what you could do to help keep our Church clean and welcoming.
