16th March 2025 — SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Dear friends,

On 24th December, 2024, Our Holy Father Pope Francis opened the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome to commence the Holy Year of Jubilee entitled: 'Pilgrims of Hope.' This theme is taken from St. Paul's letter to the Romans: "And hope does not disappoint us because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us."

What is a Jubilee Year? According to the Judaic tradition, the fields would lie fallow for a 'Sabbath Year' after six years of labour. Every seventh Sabbath Year was followed by a Jubilee Year (50 years), during which slaves were released, commercial debts were cancelled and property was returned to its original owners. This became a year of honouring God.

In our Catholic tradition, Jubilees are now celebrated every twenty-five years. Jubilees are a time of pilgrimage, thanksgiving and repentance - it is a year for seeking and giving repentance.

In the Diocese of Broken Bay, Bishop Anthony Randazzo has designated three pilgrimage sites:

Our Lady of Dolours at Chatswood contains a relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis (soon to be proclaimed a saint), the focus is a Shrine of Hope for young people.

St. Patrick's Gosford contains a relic of Pope St. John Paul II, and is designated as a Shrine of Hope for the Family.

Mary Immaculate Church, Manly, contains a relic of St. John Vianney, patron saint of priests and the focus is upon prayers for our priests, vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

When we venerate a relic, it is important to understand that this is not the same as worship. Worship is for God alone!

In venerating a saint we ask for prayers for us as we seek to grow in love for the Lord and model our lives on the virtues of that saint's life.

Lam, a young man with a disability from rural Vietnam with a passion for graphic design, faced limited career prospects due to his disability. With support from the I-SHINE program, he pursued IT training and now runs a successful freelance graphic design business.

"When I got the chance to be a part of this program, I was over the moon – just bursting with excitement and joy," Lam said.





Jubilee 2025—Pilgrims of Hope



In the Catholic Tradition, Jubilees are now celebrated every 25 years. Jubilees are a year of pilgrimage, thanksgiving and repentance – it is a year for seeking and giving forgiveness.

In the Papal the Bull <u>Spes non confundit</u> Pope Francis talks about the following key themes:

Forgive debts & give pardons

Pope Francis offers a "heartfelt appeal" to affluent nations, asking them to "acknowledge the gravity of so many of their past decisions and determine to forgive the debts of countries that will never be able to repay them." This includes "ecological debt" as addressed in Laudato Si and the pardon of prisoners.

Peace for a suffering world

Calling for a year of hope and patience in the face of much suffering in the world, Pope Francis "dreams that arms may fall silent", encouraging diplomacy to end war and a "global fund" to put an end to hunger, rather than financing weapons.

Hope for the Future

Pope Francis highlights his concern for declining birth rates, stating various reasons, including frenetic pace of life, fears about the future, lack of job security and adequate social policies. With this he also mentions his concerns for young people, stating they are the rising generation, and we must not disappoint them.

Christian Unity

Jubilee year is an opportunity to focus on Christian unity and dialogue. 2025 will be the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea. Pope Francis calls for continued work in Ecumenical dialogue, including working towards agreeing on a common date for Easter for Catholics and Orthodox. Perhaps providentally, Easter will be celebrated on the same day in 2025.
