From Fr David

Dear friends,

Regretfully, I cannot be with you this weekend as I am still in Perth having conducted a retreat for the Salvatorian Fathers in Australia this last week. With the events of this last week by which Cardinal Pell has been sentenced, I wanted you to know that I am with you in my heart, aware of the many mixed emotions you will be experiencing this weekend. I share your confusion, your sadness, and your despair. It is a moment in which we are invited to bring our gaze back on Jesus, the One who keeps calling us with invitation and possibility and whom we follow, and the One who holds us together even in the fragmentation we feel. To this end I share with you this prayer by a victim of sexual abuse, Stephen Trunk which he wrote in 2002:

We call the Spirit, source of life, Descend from heaven, show Your might. Surround us, Lord, and fill our hearts The seed of faith in us to start A way beyond these painful days, To heal these victims, Lord we pray.

Enflame our lives with fires of love, With healing mercies from above. Renew the church now wracked by sin. With Holy Justice let us win The hearts of faithful led astray.

In strife, confusion, make Your way.
Dispel the darkness, enter in.
Make clean our hearts, forgive our sin.
Make us Your sacrifice of love
The hope of victims, Christ Your Son.

Fly to me now, O heavenly Dove.
Bring down your healing, from above.
Make room to greet the Heavenly Guest.
Make straight my path to righteousness.
Cast out the sickness of my soul.
Break forth the dawn that makes me whole.
A strength within that never dies
Your Blessed Spirit in me rise.

Until the day I live with You,
Make quick my steps in wisdom true.
My every word, my every act,
Lord, You alone can guide me back.
Give thanks to God for healing hands,
For strength and weakness. Here I stand.

My life in joyful witness bring.
To Christ I bow, my prayers I sing.
Be now forever laid to rest,
My fears, my anxious cares be blessed.
No more in sorrow's land to dwell,
My spirit saved, the world to tell.


From Fr David Ranson - Diocesan Administrator





