“The hands of a Priest” is a very old poem written in Ireland, author unknown. In our contemporary world and Church, it may offer an overly sentimental and idealised view of the ordained Priesthood. Nevertheless, it is a reminder that every Priest shares in the **Priesthood of Christ**, and has the sacred duty of dispensing the Sacraments to the faithful, especially that of celebrating the holy sacrifice of the Mass. This beautiful old Irish poem reminds us of the dignity and high calling of our three Deacons as they are ordained to the Priesthood this coming Monday.

We feel their warm clasp of true friendship,

What does the Word say to us this Sunday?

First Reading (Isaiah 53:10-11). The servant of the Lord takes on himself the sins of his people, and thus becomes a source of blessings for many.


Second Reading (Hebrews 4:14-16). We can approach Jesus with confidence because he knows our weaknesses and was like us in all things except sin.

Gospel (Mark 10:35-45). Jesus is the Suffering Servant who gave his life in the humble service of his people.

The First Reading is an excerpt from Isaiah's fourth Servant Song. The Servant offers his life in atonement for the sins of his people. His death will be the beginning of glorification for him and be a source of blessings for others. By reflecting on passages such as this, the early Christians came to an understanding of the saving sufferings and death of Jesus.

In the **Gospel** we see how far the apostles are from this spirit of self-sacrifice. James and John want the top places in Jesus' kingdom. Obviously they thought that his kingdom would be modelled on worldly kingdoms, where those in high places enjoy honour, power, and glory, but Jesus tells them that his disciples are not to imitate the Gentiles, whose rulers lord it over people. In his kingdom, service is what makes one great. He would set the example himself. He came *'not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many'*.

Pray The Rosary

The Rosary consists of 20 Mysteries divided into four distinct parts – The Joyful, The Luminous, The Sorrowful and The Glorious Mysteries. Each Mystery is represented by a Decade made up of the Our Father, Ten Hail Marys and a Glory Be.



7 Meditate on 3rd Mystery, saying the "Our Father", Ten "Hail Marys" and "Glory Be".

8 Meditate on 4th Mystery, saying the "Our Father", Ten "Hail Marys" and "Glory Be".

6 Meditate on 2nd Mystery, saying the "Our Father", Ten "Hail Marys" and "Glory Be".

9 Meditate on 5th Mystery, saying the "Our Father", Ten "Hail Marys" and "Glory Be".

5 Say Ten "Hail Marys" and the "Glory Be".

10 Concluding prayers, "Hail Holy Queen" and Let Us Pray: O God, whose only begotten Son, etc."

2 Say the "Our Father"

4 Meditate on 1st Mystery, saying the "Our Father", Ten "Hail Marys" and "Glory Be".

1 Make the Sign of the Cross, say the Apostles' Creed.

3 Say Three "Hail Marys" and the "Glory Be".

Saints we remember this week

St Luke—Evangelist & Gospel Writer - First Century

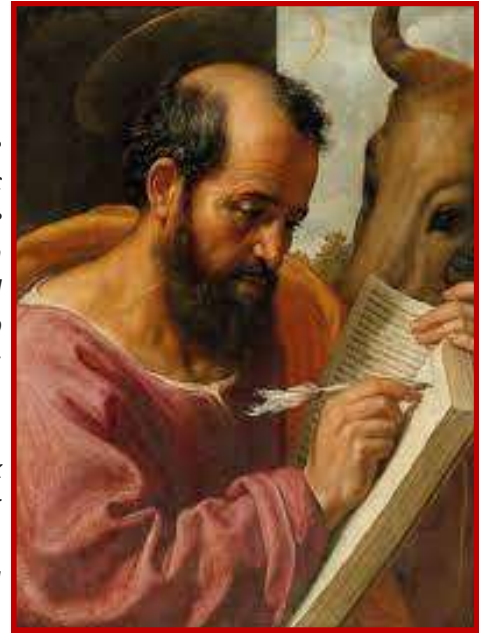
Feast Day - 18 October

Saint Luke was one of the four Evangelists but not one of the Twelve Apostles. Like Saint Mark, Luke was not among that select group who walked alongside Jesus as he journeyed through Palestine during his three years of public ministry. Luke was more likely a disciple of Saint Paul, who mentions “Luke who accompanied me on my missionary journeys”. Little is known with certainty of Luke’s life. What is known is that he wrote the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles—over a quarter of the New Testament. The two volumes of Luke and Acts are foundational works for knowing the life, works and teachings of Jesus Christ and the early Church.

Saint Luke likely wrote for a non-Jewish audience. He translates into the Greek language words that the other Gospels leave in their original language, a hint that Luke’s readers were non-Jews who could not read Hebrew and Aramaic. Luke alone tells the story of Lazarus and the rich man who repents of having ignored him.

Luke’s Gospel is famous for its infancy narrative and it is through him that we come to know so much about the place of Mary. Only Luke writes down the Virgin’s Magnificat and gives us the scriptural basis for the “Hail Mary”. His Gospel begins with the birth of Jesus and the Acts of the Apostles begin with the birth of the infant Church. The Evangelists make the original events of the life of Christ present today.

Saint Luke, your words preserving the life of Christ make you known and loved to the Church today. Through your intercession, we ask that the riches of your Gospel, especially your words about the Blessed Mother, may inspire us to be more faithful disciples. Amen



St John Paul II—Pope 1920 – 2005

Feast Day - 22 October

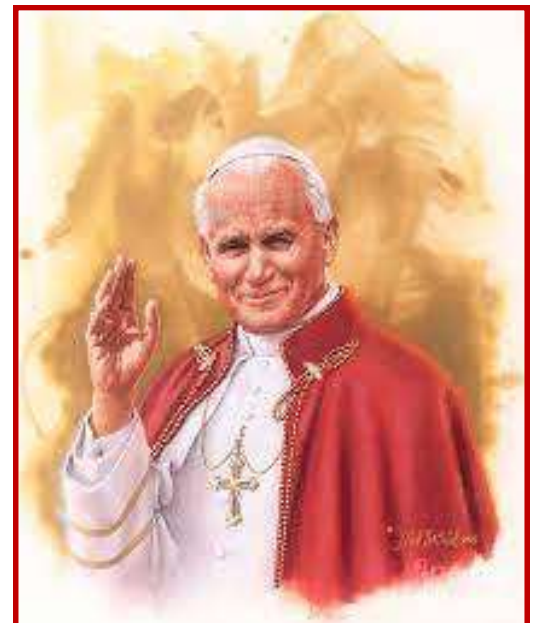
St. John Paul II, original name Karol Józef Wojtyła, (born in Poland and died in Vatican City; beatified May 1, 2011; canonized April 27, 2014; feast day October 22), bishop of Rome and head of the Catholic Church (1978–2005), the first non-Italian pope in 455 years and the first from a Slavic country.

His pontificate of more than 26 years was the third longest in history. As part of his effort to promote greater understanding between nations and between religions, he undertook numerous trips abroad, and he extended his influence beyond the Church by campaigning against the political oppression of Communism and criticising the materialism of the West. He also issued several unprecedented apologies to groups that historically had been wronged by Catholics, most notably Jews and Muslims.

Generally, John Paul used his influence among Catholics and throughout the world to advance the recognition of human dignity and to deter the use of violence. John Paul II is remembered for his fearless faith in Christ; his stand for true freedom; his outreach to the world; his dialogue with Jews and Muslims; his stand for peace; his proclamation of new saints; his concern for the dignity of woman; the dignity of the sick; his outreach to youth, especially through World Youth Day.

He called on the Church and all humanity to be open to God in the third millennium.

St John Paul, you often called to the Church in the words of Our Lord: “Do not be afraid”. Help us to live with courage and to trust in the Lord. Amen.
