A Response from Fr David to Recent Media Speculation about the Wealth of the Church

At the beginning of last week, Fairfax Media published a series of 'investigative' articles on the purported wealth of 'The Catholic Church'. I found the articles to be curious and perplexing in both their assumptions and their assertions. Such premises require reply.

It is common to refer to the 'Catholic Church' and to speak of it as a single, monolithic entity. However, what we refer to as 'the Catholic Church' is, in fact, a communion of diverse communities, institutes and agencies which bear the title 'Catholic.' They bear this title because the diverse entities are united by their common belief, practice, affiliation and aspiration. However, each of them, of which there are some 3000 in Australia, are independent from one other, legally and financially. Though there is a shared structure of belief and religious practice, there is no single administration. There is no 'parent company' of which individual entities are discreet 'holdings' or 'franchises' as might be in the commercial world. This is not some ingenious way by which 'the Church' keeps its assets hidden and protected, but it pertains to the very nature of the Church which as always been the case from its commencement, and always will be. Each Catholic community, institute or agency has its own capacity for the acquisition of property and each bears responsibility for its own financial management. If one were to calculate the assets and funds of these Catholic entities, collectively, then I am sure the outcome would be very significant. However, each entity has no rights or responsibilities in regards to another. The Bishop of Broken Bay has no right or responsibility to the assets and funds owned by the Marist Fathers, for example, just as the Sisters of St Joseph, for example, have no rights or responsibility in regards to the funds or assets owned by our own Parish of Holy Name. It is grossly misleading to think that the assets of every Catholic entity are commonly available to all in the Church, and that 'the Catholic Church' can dispense of the assets of various Catholic entities as someone deems desirable.

Our own Parish is one particular Catholic entity. Though governed by our local Bishop in our pastoral life, we are responsible for our own financial sustainability in the conduct of our administration, community life and pastoral activity. Though we enjoy a valuable asset in our property, as you know we, ourselves, generate the most meagre annual surplus, if at all. Adhering strictly to recognized accounting procedures and systems, our income and expenditure is scrutinized quarterly by our canonically required Finance Committee comprised of professional accountants and business men and women, audited by professional Auditors, and is publicly made available to all parishioners every year. There is no secret wealth! We operate with complete public transparency and accountability of all monies received and spent.

If Fairfax Media is to engage in genuine investigative journalism, it might care to detail which particular Catholic communities, institutes, or agencies are not transparent and accountable in their financial management? It is spurious to suggest that Catholic entities are not, even if their annual statements are not published in The Sydney Morning Herald. To do so may create wonderful journalistic sensationalism, but hardly leads to a genuine analysis of both the social and economic contribution of the breadth of Catholic entities to Australian society, both currently and historically.

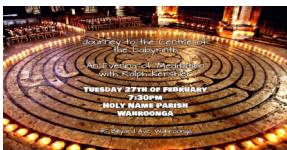

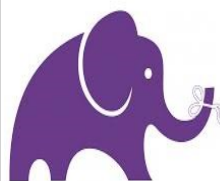
