19 December — FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT



From Fr Paul Today's Gospel is St Luke's account of the Visitation of Mary to her cousin, Elizabeth following the Annunciation (Luke 1.39-55). This apparently simple story offers us a key insight into how Mary was remembered and celebrated within the early Church. Remember the Gospels reveal how the Good News is being told and celebrated from the earliest times of the Church.

It is fitting that Mary takes us this last part of the Advent journey to Christ because that is Mary's mission and vocation: she gives birth to Christ not only in our world but also in our hearts. In her beautiful prayer, the Magnificat (Luke 1.46-55), Mary speaks on behalf of all humanity celebrating the great things God has done for us in Christ.

What does the Word say to us today — the fourth Sunday of Advent?

First Reading (Micah 5:1-4). The prophet Micah announces to the beleaguered inhabitants of Jerusalem that a Ruler will come from Bethlehem who will bring them peace.

Second Reading (Hebrews 10:5-10). Jesus came, not to offer the sacrifices of the old law, but to do the will of God. His one perfect sacrifice replaced all the former sacrifices.

Gospel (Luke 1:39-45). Elizabeth praises Mary, and, enlightened by the Holy Spirit, tells of the uniqueness of the child she has conceived.

When Micah was writing (late eighth-century BC) Jerusalem was under siege and David's dynasty was in jeopardy, but salvation would come from a comparatively insignificant place - Bethlehem. From there a new leader would come to gather together the scattered exiles and unite the nation once more. Christians see this promise as foreshadowing the coming of Jesus, the Prince of Peace, who was born in Bethlehem and descended from the line of David.

The Gospel tells the story of Mary's visit to Elizabeth. Both are pregnant. Enlightened and moved by the Holy Spirit, Elizabeth praises Mary and tells of the uniqueness of the child she has conceived. Elizabeth speaks faith of the infant Church, revealing the place of honour in which Mary was held from the beginning.

His place is with those who do not belong, who are rejected by power because they are regarded as weak, those who are discredited, who are denied the status of persons, tortured, exterminated. With those for whom there is no room, Christ is present in this world. He is mysteriously present in those for whom there seems to be nothing but the world at its worst."




