In your loving providence, send abundant rain to quench the fires and to restore our parched earth.



Update on Davin and Sharon

Dear friends

It has been wonderful to have our Parish Secretary, Jackie back with us after the Christmas period, and to begin the preparation for the year ahead. Here are just some of the exciting events planned for our parish in 2020:

- Lenten Dinners with a focus on the forthcoming Plenary
 Commencing 27 February for the 6 weeks of Lent
- Tuesday 24 Marc Concert: Tenebrae with Thomas Wilson and Anna Fraser
- From the end of June though to October: Parish Forums on the Plenary Council at the service of developing a parish pastoral plan for the coming years
- Bach Akademie Concert: 5 April, 7 June. 23 August, 15 November
- Parish International Food Fair: 31 May—Pentecost Sunday.

Recently, we learnt that Dennis Morgan has moved to McQuoin Park, Waitara given his need now for advanced care. Dennis has been such a significant member of our parish community over so many years. It was he who was the architect of the elegant refurbishment of the sanctuary in our church some fifteen years ago, and he has given such an enormous contribution to our Parish Schola for many, many years. We will much miss seeing him as part of our wonderful choir. I take this opportunity to record our community's deep gratitude to Dennis and to Patricia, and assure them both of our continued prayer.

As many will recall, towards the end of 2017 our Parish was a beneficiary in the will of the late Marie Shortis. Some \$92,000 was given to the Parish to be distributed to those whom the Parish considered to be in necessitous circumstances. After much deliberation this money has now been acquitted. Our Parish has been able to assist the refurbishment of CatholicCare's "Kate's Place" for autistic children with a grant of \$50,000, Cana Communities with a donation of \$20,000, and a donation of \$12, 979.99 to Ku-ring-gai Women's Shelter with the intention of the same amount to The Dish mobile kitchen for homeless in Hornsby. All have been profoundly appreciative of this generosity and assistance. Thank you Marie!

A Summer Holiday for our Musicians

We are gifted with the remarkable generosity of many musicians and singers in our Parish! They enable our celebrations to be ones of joy and prayer for which we are profoundly grateful. This year we have decided to revert to a practice of years past—of giving our musicians and singers a holiday during the month of January. During our weekends in January therefore our Masses will have a more simple presentation without music.

Our friends have now been discharged from Royal North Shore Hospital!

Tuesday 14 January Day 36.

Five weeks since the volcano eruption and another milestone passed. Davin, Sharon & Leanne are now in Mt Wilga Hospital in Hornsby, which specialises in rehab. Sharon moved here yesterday. And whilst we originally thought that Leung might be another week or so at the burns unit in RNS, the doctor told him that he could be released today. So he walked onto the ambulance himself and here we are. As Mt Wilga Hosp doesn't have a burns unit, the 3 of them will need to go back to RNS twice a week to have their dressings changed and wounds assessed.

We have started asking for photos every time Davin gets his dressings changed. We were pleasantly surprised to see some significant improvement in the condition of the wounds on his arms and legs between the last 2 sets of photos. Davin is walking around quite freely now. And regaining strength slowly. There is still a lot of pain in the arms and hands when the pain medication wears off. He still admits to waking up several times each night, in pain, and having to ask for extra pain relief. Overall, considering the extent of his injuries, he is doing remarkably well.

Sharon had her first short rehab session today to work out a baseline for her starting point. Initial exercises include trying to curl their fingers into a fist. Something all 3 of them can't do at the moment because of the tightness of the skin. The physio has mentioned that sometimes, it might not be possible to regain full flexibility in the injured limbs. We pray that won't be the case here.

Family members are taking turns to cook something for their dinners almost every night. Dawn, Sharon & Leanne's mum (Adeline), my mum, other aunties, etc. Even I'm chipping in with a lamb stew for tomorrow night. The food at Mt Wilga is apparently much better than RNS. But still can't beat home cooking.
