

## 19th June The Most Holy BODY and BLOOD of CHRIST (Corpus Christi)

Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate **the Solemnity of Corpus Christi**, the body and blood of Christ, which highlights one of the distinctive features of the Catholic faith.

Jesus refers to himself as "the living bread come down from heaven". We, his disciples, are to be fed and nourished by this "living bread come down from heaven" as we make our way to the freedom and joy and eternal salvation of our homeland in heaven, where we will remain in the love of the Trinity.

St John tells us at the beginning of his Gospel that Jesus is the Word of God made flesh. By his word, this Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ is instituted:

He broke bread saying: "Take and eat if it, for this is my body, which will be given up for you." He took the chalice saying: "This is the chalice of my blood...which will be poured out for you."

Bread and wine is transformed, trans-substantiated by the power of Jesus' Word and the action of the Spirit. This is something not of our own making, but something instituted by Christ himself: we celebrate the Eucharist at his command:

"Do this in remembrance of me; do this in memory of me"

# What does the Word of God say to us today -The Solemnity of Corpus Christi?

The **First Reading (Genesis 14:18-20)** tells how Melchizedek, king of Salem (early name for Jerusalem), comes to greet Abraham. Melchizedek is also a priest. ## Quotes to help us reflect on the Feast of Corpus Christi

We must always bear in mind that the Eucharist is not something we do. It is not our own commemoration of what Jesus said and did. No. It is precisely an act of Christ!

It is Christ who acts there, who is on the altar. It is a gift of Christ, who makes himself present and gathers us around him, to nourish us with his Word and with his life.

### General Audience, Pope Francis

Recognise in this bread what hung on the cross, and in this chalice what flowed from his side.

### St Augustine of Hippo (354-43)

I have no taste for the food that perishes nor for the pleasures of this life. I want the bread of God, which is the flesh of Christ, who was the seed of David; and for drink I desire his blood which is love that cannot be destroyed.

### St Ignatius of Antioch (50-117)


The flesh feeds on the body and blood of Christ, that the soul likewise may be filled with God.

### Tertullian (155 - 240)

Our bodies, having received the Eucharist, are no longer corruptible, because they have the hope of the resurrection.

### St Irenaeus of Lyons (130 - 202)

**St John Chrysostom (349-407)** reminds us that Jesus who said "This is my Body" also said "I was hungry and you gave me to eat." We are nourished and strengthened by the Body of Christ that we may be the Body of Christ for others.
