2nd February — The PRESENTATION of the LORD

Dear Friends,

This weekend in our Sunday Masses we hear the beautiful words of St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians (Cor 12:31-13:13) in which he speaks about the nature of love. We know that all love, in whatever form it may take is from God alone.


St. Paul reminds us that unless we speak the words of love: kindness, never being boastful or conceited, rude or selfish, then our words and actions sound hollow and rumbling. He says we sound like a 'gong booming or a cymbal clashing.'

The American psychologist and author Eric From in his book, 'The Art of Loving,' describes love as an art form. In other words love is something like learning a musical instrument, becoming a painter or successful sportsperson. It takes time, effort and perseverance. Many times, we feel like giving up, we say 'it's all just too hard.' But I think that's the moment where we try to persevere and not allow our own strength defeat us. St Paul says to the Corinthians: 'Love delights in the truth...it is always ready to excuse, to hope, and to endure whatever comes.'

The counsel of St Paul is to do all things with and in love, so that our confidence and resolve move us forward. All is done with the help of God, who, loves and cares for our future as his people. Finally, St Paul says: 'there are three things that last: faith, hope and love; and the greatest of these is love.'




