The Epiphany of the Lord from Fr Paul

I hope all the families of the parish have enjoyed a happy and holy Christmas. **Thank you** once again to all who contributed to making the Christmas Liturgies so beautiful and meaningful. The priests and parish team thank you for your prayers, good wishes, cards and gifts received during the Christmas season. Thank you for your thoughtfulness to us and for your generosity to others outside the parish.

Today's Gospel tells of the visit of the three Magi to the newborn Christ child. When they found him, the Magi offered him gold, frankincense and myrrh.

<u>Gold</u> is the gift for kings (see 1 Kings 9:14, 28); it symbolizes kingship and royalty—a fitting gift for the "King of kings" (1 Timothy 6:15). Gold has historically served as a most precious metal and form of currency. It is a pure and incorruptible metal, suitable for the One who is without sin. Some traditions further note that gold is a symbol of divinity, recognizing Jesus as God in human form.

<u>Frankincense</u> is sweet-smelling incense. Frankincense was mixed with oil for anointing priests. Thus, it can represent the Lord's priesthood and his role as the Lamb of God to be sacrificed on our behalf (see John 1:29). The psalmist prays: "May my prayer rise before you like incense." Like the frankincense, Jesus' life would be given up as a sacred offering in obedience to the Father for the sins of humanity.

<u>Myrrh</u> is associated with the death of Jesus. Myrrh was mixed with the wine and offered to Jesus on the cross (Mark 15:23) and its bitter taste is associated with the suffering Jesus endured on the cross. The use of myrrh in embalming and preparing the body for burial points to the death of Jesus.

So the three gifts are highly symbolic, reminding us that Jesus is King of Kings, Son of God, our one and only true High Priest who suffers and dies for all humanity.

We reflect:

- ♦ How do I greet the newborn King, the child Jesus?
- ♦ Do I follow the star seeking him? Do I bring him gifts?
- Do I receive the gift of his salvation, his riches, his peace and his life?

What do the Readings say to us on this Sunday -

First Reading (Is 60:1-6). The prophet cheers the exiles who returned from Babylon with a vision of a restored city. The prophecy is fulfilled in Christ and in the new Israel, the Church.

Second Reading (Eph 3:2-3, 5-6). St Paul expresses the theological meaning of the feast: God invites Jew and Gentile to share the salvation brought by Christ. The feast shows that election by God is not a privilege for some, but a gift for all.

Gospel (Mt 2:1-12). Three Gentile Magi came from a far country to pay homage to the Christ-child, while the Jewish leaders rejected him.

The Magi can serve as models for us on our faith journey. When they found Christ they offered him gold, frankincense and myrrh. Their hearts are awakened and burst into life.

The Magi return home changed and enriched by their encounter with Christ.

When we find Christ and offer our love to him, he will help us to open up the treasures of goodness that lie buried within us, so that we can offer 'gifts' to our brothers and sisters.
