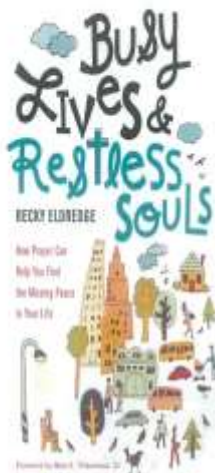

The group outing on Sunday 26th May to the Hyde Park War Memorial was a wonderful experience.

The weather was pleasant with lots of sunshine. We walked through Hyde Park for a brief visit to St Mary's Cathedral where we were heard the Cathedral organ being played and the sound of the church bells ringing out, and then we traversed through the park via a fine avenue of Morton Bay Fig Trees to the most attractive reflection pond recessed in the pavement in the approach to the War Memorial.



The reception was memorable, to find men in period full dress uniform from the Boer War, and Gallipoli to WW1, these men were representing the NSW Lancers, one of whom was bearing a regimental Pennant. There were also several men dressed in civilian clothes wearing an array of medals as this occasion was a remembrance of the Boer War.



The entire War Memorial has been given over to a huge array of diorama, photographs, graphic displays across all the major conflicts from early conflicts up to Afghanistan, as well as weapons, diaries, field equipment, and a huge array of memorabilia that was too extensive to list. One of the dioramas showed the drama and extent of the muddy fields at Passchendaele. We absorbed this material for several hours, but one could spend a week to see everything. This memorable visit was followed by a pub lunch at 'The Edinburgh Castle Hotel' in the city. In all the outing was very inspiring.
