

The fourth candle, which is often named the Angel Gabriel Candle is for those messengers who bring God's Word into our world.

## From Fr David

## Parish Events

#### Dear friends,

Last Tuesday morning we lost power to the Priory and to the Parish Office. The Church has remained unaffected. Upon consultation with our electricians and AusGrid, we recognised that we were faced with a major problem. The wiring behind our meter board (which showed itself to be the original 1930s wiring) had burnt out. We are very fortunate that we did not have a house fire. However, further investigation revealed that the problem not only lay with the board and is ancient wiring but with the cable on our property that brings the power from Chilton Parade to the Priory. Consequently, this has made the repairs a major and very expensive project. A new cable is now required as well as a new meter board. Excavation for the cable is required. In the face of such a crisis, we are grateful that we do still have a house (!), that the situation developed when it did and not a week later, and that we were able to locate a company who could undertake the work that was required. The company has been very diligent and we have confidence that we are working with the right people. Already, new cables and conduits have been ordered, a new compliant meter box has been installed, and excavation for the cable has commenced, and will progress over this weekend. Subsequently, the egress to Chilton Parade has been closed off to all traffic and will remain closed until Christmas Eve. We are hopeful that electricity will be restored to the Priory and the Parish Office on Tuesday or Wednesday. Inevitably, the project is expensive. The total cost will be \$37,400. As you can imagine, this is quite an expected cost. However, we have had no option other than to proceed. Thankfully, given the current healthy financial position of the Church Account we can manage such expenditure, even though of course it represents a considerable dent in our cash reserve. Notwithstanding, it is for such emergencies that we have building up our reserve. Some years ago we would have needed to take out a loan in such an event. Still, if anyone may be in a position to assist us to meet this expenditure, even in a small way, your generosity would be deeply appreciated. What a challenging year it has been! However, we keep smiling! My deep appreciation to Jackie, our Parish Secretary, and to Fr Anselam for their good humour during this time when we have had to keep the engine room of the Parish going in the face of such limitation. Necessity is the mother of invention, but great humour is also the midwife!

This last week has seen the end of the school year! It was a joy to celebrate Mass at Prouille on Wednesday morning and with the staff of St Leo's on Friday morning. The new year will see a significant change in staff at our primary school of Prouille, We thank Mrs Sue Bevan for her leadership of the parish school over the last 3 years, along with Mr Mark Catazanriti who has been acting REC for the past twelve months. Next year we welcome a new leadership team of Genevieve Smith (Principal), Sharon Kelly (Deputy Principal), and Samantha Sheather (REC). Having met all three new leaders, I am very confident that with our new Parish Priest, Fr Paul Durkin, there will be a wonderful experience of collaboration between our parish and school.
