From Fr David

Dear friends,

Thanks be to God I arrived safely back home last Monday from overseas. It was the most remarkable trip and one that was filled with many wonderful memories. Perhaps some of you were able to follow the blog of my time with the Bishops of Australia in Rome that was developed on the Diocesan website? Certainly there you will be able to trace the most significant events of the experience. The trip was historical for a number of reasons: for the retreat with the Bishops at Arricia; for the most extraordinary couple of hours shared with Pope Frances; for the tone of the meetings with the many Dicasteries which demonstrated wisdom, pastoral sensitivity and care; for the personal assistance given me by various officials on some diocesan matters; and for the heatwave which engulfed Rome whilst we were there. To have been a part of it would indeed be one of the most privileged experiences of my life. I do not take this for granted, and am humbled by the trust of the Diocese which underpinned every part of it. I want to express my particular gratitude to Fr Anselam and to Fr Eliseus who "kept the home fires burning" during my absence. Fr Anselam is a priest with exceptional pastoral presence and generosity.

After Rome, I had the pleasure of some days at Vicenza in the north of Italy, guest of a dear friend, Fr Reynaldo Roman-Diaz and the Divine Word Missionary community to which he belongs. Fr Reynaldo now works with Caritas Vicenza and the refugees who have reached Italy from Mali and Eritrea. The work that the diocesan Caritas undertakes is inspirational and I was able to visit a number of their projects for refugees, for prisoners and for the homeless. Fr Reynaldo also introduced me to the glories of Venice, Bergamo and Milan! From Venice I flew to Paris for several days during which I enjoyed lunch one day with one of the Auxiliary Bishops to learn more about the particular model of seminary formation established by the Archdiocese of Paris. Notre Dame Cathedral continues to stand beautiful and compelling, even as its structure remains uncertain and fragile. For me, it has become such a symbol of our Church at the this time. A short stay in Hanoi, Vietnam on the way home greatly assisted me in the adjustment to the time differences.

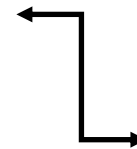

Saints Anne and Joachim—Grandparents of Jesus

This saintly couple are parents to Mary and grandparents to Jesus. With such amazing offspring, Joachim and Anne must shared an extraordinary love. They have long been held up as exemplars for married couples, and in fact, they are one of the few married couple saints canonised in the Catholic Church.

We know very few facts about Sts. Anne and Joachim, the only recorded stories of them are from an apocryphal gospel dating from the 4th Century AD called the Protoevangelium of James. The legend told in this document says that after years of childlessness, an angel appeared to tell Anne and Joachim that they would have a child. Whatever their names or the facts of their lives, we can assume that Mary was raised in a Jewish family home faithful to God and to the religious traditions of her day such that she was led to respond wholeheartedly to God's request with faith, "Let it be done to me as you will." 
