Dear Parishioners

Today is the sixth Sunday of Easter. We have two more weeks of the 50 days of Eastertide Season. Next Sunday we shall celebrate the Ascension of the Lord and then the following Sunday ends Eastertide with the celebration of Pentecost, often considered to mark the birth of the Church.

You may have noticed that members of the men's Bible study have hosted the BBQ after 9:30am Mass on the first Sunday of each month. If you, as a family, or other group in the parish, would like to volunteer facilitating morning tea or a BBQ on other weeks of the month, please contact the Parish Office.

With the opening of the Church and hopefully the bulk of the Covid restrictions behind us, we are committed to the ongoing life of our parish. Please let family members, neighbours and others know they are welcome to join us for worship and other activities.

The bulk of our tree lopping (with permission from Ku-ring-gai Council) was done last Tuesday. The tree loppers will return in the next month or so to clear some further trees and branches they feel could be dangerous if not removed.

Holy Name Wahroonga has been given pastoral responsibility for both Lady Davidson Hospital and Southern Cross Care (SCC), North Turramurra. The latter includes care for the beautiful chapel in the grounds of SCC, having been established for the convent of the Nazareth House Sisters who once conducted the facility. Fr Sam and I will continue to provide Anointing of the Sick and Pastoral Care for all those who request, and will regularly celebrate Mass for the Catholic residents.

You may have heard the sad news that the Euthanasia bill passed into law this past week in NSW. This is in direct contradiction to Catholic teaching on the inviolable dignity of human life. A copy of Bishop Anthony Randazzo's response is published in the Mail Chimp that is sent out electronically to parishioners and a hard copy is available at the back of the church.

A constant feature of parish life is the celebration of the Sacraments. Congratulations to the Dixon family and the Stipo family on the baptism of Olive Rose and Stella Violet. Olive is the granddaughter of proud grandparents Noel and Cecilia Kean.



Saints We Remember This Week

On 15th May, Pope Francis canonised 10 new saints. They include a Dutch priest-journalist who was killed by the Nazis, a lay Indian convert who was killed for his faith and a half-dozen French and Italian priests and nuns who founded religious orders.


The ten new saints are Saints Titus Brandsma (1881-1942), Lazarus Devasahayam Pillai (1712-1752), César de Bus (1544-1607), Luigi Maria Palazzolo (1827-1886), Giustino Russolillo (1891-1955), Charles de Foucauld (1858-1916), Anne-Marie Rivier (1768-1838), Anna Maria Rubatto (1844-1904), Carolina (Maria of Jesus) Santocanale (1852-1923), and Maria Domenica Mantovani (1862-1934).

We believe that from the moment of our Baptism, we are called to holiness; we are called to be saints. These ten saints remind us that despite our human weakness and sinfulness, holiness is possible and it is worth it to strive towards holiness. That striving can bring us incredible joy and peace and allow us to share that joy and peace with others.

Celebrating the Feast of Mary, Help of Christians in Australia.... Feast Day May 24

The feast day to Mary Help of Christians has been celebrated in Australia since 1844. The infant church in Australia had a special reason for turning to Mary. No priests were sent to the colony in its early days and Mass was not allowed except for one brief year until 1820. It was largely the Rosary in those early days that kept the faith alive.

St Mary's Cathedral was dedicated in her honour by the Irish pioneer priest, Fr John Therry, who arrived in Sydney in 1820 and assumed responsibility for the planning and initial construction of the Cathedral. When Australia became the first country to have Mary Help of Christians as Patroness, it became the first country to have a mother-cathedral under the same title. In fact, the altar at St. Mary's, with its statue of Mary Help of Christians, was erected as a memorial to Fr. Therry's name.



Mary Help of Christians patroness of Australia and of the Military Ordinariate Almighty God,

deepen in our hearts our love of Mary Help of Christians. Through her prayers and under her protection, may the light of Christ shine over our land. May Australia be granted harmony, justice and peace. Grant wisdom to our leaders and integrity to our citizens. Bless especially the men and women of the Australian Defence Force and their families. We ask this through Christ Our Lord. Amen. Mary Help of Christians, pray for us.

St Philip Neri 1515 - 1595 Feast Day 26 May

St. Philip Neri was a Christian missionary and founder of the Congregation of the Oratory, a community of Catholic priests and lay brothers. He received his early teachings from friars at a Dominican monastery in Italy. At 18-years-old, he experienced a mystical vision, which he eventually spoke of as his Christian conversion. This event was an encounter with the Lord and it dramatically changed his life. In 1535, he set out to help the poor people of Rome. Philip would lead his followers to hospitals to wait on the sick or to the Church, to pray to and encounter Jesus Christ. In short, Philip was an evangelist. He loved to share the Gospel and help people to find or rediscover their faith in Jesus Christ.

In 1548, Philip founded the Confraternity of the Most Holy Trinity. Philip was ordained to the diaconate and then to the priesthood in 1551. Philip was respected and loved throughout Rome; he became a trusted advisor to popes, kings, cardinals and equally as important to the poor. He whole-heartedly worked towards the reform of the Catholic Church. and worked toward that with a sense of gentleness and friendship, rather than criticism and harshness. His efforts to reach out to the lay people of Rome and not simply associate with the clergy made him one of the great figures in the Counter Reformation of the Catholic Church.

St. Philip Neri was beatified by Pope Paul V on May 11, 1615 and canonized by Pope Gregory XV on March 12, 1622.
