

Spírit of St Lucy's

Dear friends

It is wonderful to be home again after such restorative annual leave. It was a great combination of rest and discovery. After an initial week in Canberra, I set out west, first of all to Kiacatoo, near Condobolin, and then to Cobar, to Whitecliffs, to Bourke and to Tamworth and Armidale. It was the first time that I had been to many of these places and it was a thrill to experience the wide open space of the Outback. After such distances, it was good to have over a week at the beach at Kingscliff and then another week back in Sydney before returning home. Thankfully, the entire trip occurred without incident, although I had one lucky escape on an Outback road!

My special thanks to Fr Anselam and Fr Joey and to Jackie our Parish Secretary for all their work during my absence. They really are the best team of colleagues to have!

My gratitude, too, to our Parish Pastoral and Missionary Council which has been considering how my time in the Parish may be best celebrated. Bishop Anthony has announced during the week that Fr Joey is to be appointed as Assistant Priest to the Parish of Chatswood, effective 7 December. We thank Fr Joey for his gentle presence with us over this year and especially for his much valued ministry to our schools in more recent months. He has been tremendous company to Fr Anselam and me in the presbytery especially during this COVID time. He is taking his own annual leave for the next two weeks and will rejoin us for the first weekend in December before he leaves us.






We have an amazing team of volunteers who give their time each week to enable us to participate in our swimming sessions, as it would be impossible to do so without extra support encouragement.
