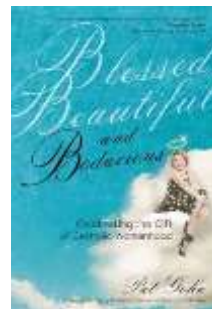

At St Lucy's we find that the pastoral support we offer often extends beyond that of the student, to our families as well. One way in which we offer that support is to send some meals home to families in crisis. We have an onsite emergency meals freezer which is stocked through the kind donations of meals cooked by staff members and other parents within the community. However, currently the demand is outweighing the supply, as we have a number of families requiring this service on a weekly basis with up to three meals going home to each of them.

Often we are approached by members of the Holy Name Parish community enquiring as to how they can offer us support, and this is one way in which you might like to do this. Our families will eat anything that is sent home – meat, fish, vegetarian, curries, pastas, pies, etc etc. They are always just so grateful to have one less thing to worry about when they are in such crisis situations as what we find them in.
