23rd April, 2023 - Third Sunday of Easter

Dear friends,

A couple of months ago I celebrated the funeral of a friend who had died suddenly being in his early seventies. The interesting point about his funeral Mass is that he chose this gospel passage we hear this Sunday from St. Luke (Lk 24:13-35), where the two unnamed disciples are walking away from all that has happened in Jerusalem, and then encounter Jesus on the road, and recognise him at the breaking of bread. I didn't have the opportunity to ask him why he chose this particular gospel, as it normally isn't amongst those that are chosen for funerals. I can only speculate that his walking to and from the church each day spoke to his journey of encountering the Lord in the Word and the Eucharist at Mass.

Like the disciples, who were talking about the death of Jesus, while trying to make sense of what had happened, we too can feel lost and meandering when someone we love dies and we can't comprehend their death. It is only when Jesus is part of our lives that we begin to see that death is not the end. The story isn't over. We are people of hope and belief in the promise Jesus made that he would rise from the dead.

As we make our journey home from our Mass today, let us remember that Jesus is now within us, and, accompanies us wherever we go in the Scriptures and the Breaking of Bread.



Come As You Are (CAYA) Discussion and Reflection Group

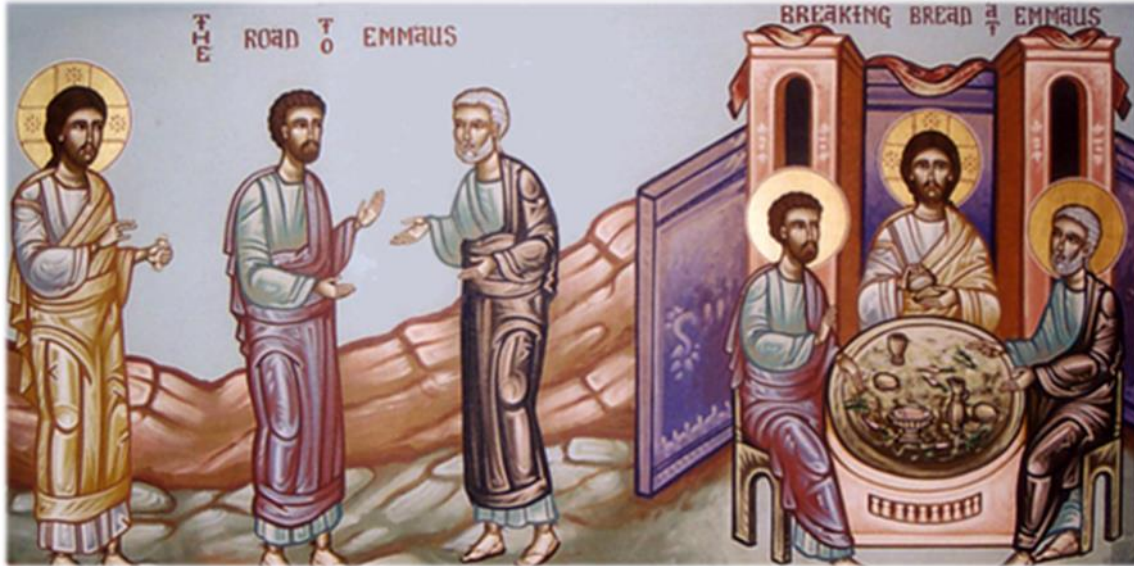
Recommences Thursday, 4th May following morning Mass.
