23rd March 2025 — THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

Dear friends,

Charles de Foucauld (1858-1916) was a member of the French cavalry who undergoing a spiritual crisis came back to his Catholic faith. He chose to live as a hermit in the Sahara desert by an oasis. He lived a life of prayer and simplicity. He hoped that others would join him, but they never did. For reasons which have never become clear, he was assassinated by Tuareg nomads in 1916.



There was nothing to show for his life: no converts, no followers, just some writings and his daily prayer which read: 'Father, I abandon myself into your hands. Do with me what you will.' Twenty years later Rene Voillaume and four other priests came to live on the edge of the Sahara and live as Charles had done. Charles' writings and his daily prayer encouraged men and women to form communities through the world called the 'Little Brothers and Sisters of Jesus.'

The gospel today calls us to be patient, persevering and faithful in trying to live in God's time, when our lives like the fig tree, seem to bear no fruit. Our lives as Christians in this world are not about success and fame, but about our daily living not as we want, but as God calls us to be: rich in mercy and motivated by love. Like the fig tree in the gospel, our lives are called to bear fruit, but not in the way we expect, but simply trusting in God's ways, which are thankfully not reliant on our human standards. Charles de Foucauld never saw the fruits of his labours, but faithfully trusted in God's ways for him.

May we, like Charles de Foucauld, foster a desire to live more simply and meaningfully, by listening to the voice of God speaking to us in the depths of our hearts, calling us to follow him.





Jubilee 2025—Pilgrims of Hope



In the Catholic Tradition, Jubilees are now celebrated every 25 years. Jubilees are a year of pilgrimage, thanksgiving and repentance – it is a year for seeking and giving forgiveness.

In the Papal the Bull Spes non confundit Pope Francis talks about the following key themes:

Forgive debts & give pardons

Pope Francis offers a "heartfelt appeal" to affluent nations, asking them to "acknowledge the gravity of so many of their past decisions and determine to forgive the debts of countries that will never be able to repay them." This includes "ecological debt" as addressed in Laudato Si and the pardon of prisoners.

Peace for a suffering world

Calling for a year of hope and patience in the face of much suffering in the world, Pope Francis "dreams that arms may fall silent", encouraging diplomacy to end war and a "global fund" to put an end to hunger, rather than financing weapons.

Hope for the Future

Pope Francis highlights his concern for declining birth rates, stating various reasons, including frenetic pace of life, fears about the future, lack of job security and adequate social policies. With this he also mentions his concerns for young people, stating they are the rising generation, and we must not disappoint them.

Christian Unity

Jubilee year is an opportunity to focus on Christian unity and dialogue. 2025 will be the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea. Pope Francis calls for continued work in Ecumenical dialogue, including working towards agreeing on a common date for Easter for Catholics and Orthodox. Perhaps providentally, Easter will be celebrated on the same day in 2025.
