

Message for today, Divine Mercy Sunday - second Sunday of Easter 24th April, 2022

In February 1931, Jesus appeared to a humble nun, Sr Maria Faustina Kowalska, in Poland. He appeared as the 'King of Divine Mercy', wearing a white garment, with rays of white and red light shining from his heart. He told her to paint his image, with the words: 'Jesus, I trust in You'. He said he wanted this image venerated, first in her chapel, and then throughout the world. He promised that anyone who venerates this image will not perish.

Divine Mercy is at the heart of the Gospel and of the Paschal (Easter) Mystery. Celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday honours Jesus' request to St Faustina (Diary, n 699), and also re-claims the early church practice of naming the Easter Octave as "the days of divine mercy and pardon".

What is the Divine Mercy message in a nutshell? To quote from the Diary of St Faustina:

Ask God for His Mercy - "...be willing to talk openly with your God of Mercy who wants to speak words of pardon and lavish his graces on you." Diary #1485 and "... Do not lose heart coming for pardon, for I am always ready to forgive you. As often as you beg for it, you glorify My mercy." Diary #1488;

Be merciful to others - The Merciful shall be shown Mercy ... "three ways of exercising mercy - by deed, by word, by prayer. In these three degrees is contained the fullness of mercy..." Diary # 742; and

Trust in Jesus completely - "... if your trust is great, then my generosity will be without limit." Diary #548 and "...Your great trust in Me forces Me to continuously grant you graces ..." Diary # 718.

Funeral for Patricia Morgan

A Requiem Mass for Patricia Morgan (widow of Dennis and mother of Damian, Frances and Sarah), will be celebrated here at Holy Name Church on Friday, 29th April at 10:30am.

What does the Word say to us this Divine Mercy Sunday Second Sunday of Easter?

First Reading (Acts 5:12-16). This tells of the high regard in which the apostles were held by the ordinary people, and of the cures they worked for the sick in the infant Church.

Second Reading (Revelation 1:9-13, 17-19). John is inspired to write a message - one which has meaning for the Church until the end of time.

Gospel (John 20:19-31). By seeing and touching the wounds of his risen Lord, Thomas the doubter is cured of his unbelief.

Like the apostle Thomas, from time to time we all doubt. We should not hide our questions. We must do what Thomas did - bring those doubts to the Lord. And our risen Lord will say to us what he said to Thomas: 'do not doubt, but believe.' Thomas' profession of faith, 'My Lord and my God', sums up the faith of the Church.

In the Gospel, we have St John's version of Pentecost, the birthday of the Church. The risen Jesus appears to his apostles, showing them his wounds and bestowing peace on them. He gives them the gift of the Spirit and inaugurates the mission of the Church, which is the continuation of his own mission (to preach repentance for the forgiveness of sins).

One of the effects of the gift of the Spirit was that the Church had the power to forgive sins. The Church's use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (or Confession) is one valid and legitimate way of exercising the power over sin given by the risen Jesus to his apostles.



Quote for the Week Divine Mercy Sunday, Second Sunday of Easter 24th April, 2022

"My daughter, have fear of nothing; I am always with you. All your adversaries will harm you only to the degree that I permit them to do so. You are my dwelling place and my constant repose. For your sake I will withhold the hand which punishes; for your sake I bless the earth." (No. 431)

"All grace flows from mercy, and 'the last hour' abounds with mercy for us. Let no one doubt concerning the goodness of God; even if a person's sins were as dark as night, God's mercy is stronger than our misery. One thing alone is necessary; that the sinner set ajar the door of his heart, be it ever so little, to let in a ray of God's merciful grace, and then God will do the rest." (No. 1507)

"When I see that a burden is beyond my strength, I do not consider or analyse it or probe into it, but I run like a child to the Heart of Jesus and say only one word to Him: "You can do all things." And then I keep silent, because I know that Jesus Himself will intervene in the matter, and as for me, instead of tormenting myself, I use that time to love Him." (No. 1033)
