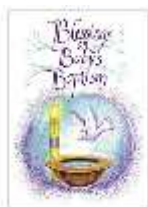

From Fr David

Dear friends,

At time of such darkness as in the event of terrorism in Christchurch last Friday afternoon, we draw hope from the many moments of grace that also fill our lives. The light of these moments dispel the shadows of our world and our hearts. There were many moments of grace in the mosques of Christchurch last Friday as we learn off the stories of heroism and forgiveness. These moments are indicators to us that love is stronger than fear, hope more enduring than despair.

During this week I enjoyed a wonderful moment of grace when I joined the Year 6 leaders of all the schools in our Diocese. They came together for a morning of reflection at the Light of Christ Centre in Waitara followed by Mass in the Cathedral. I shared with them six lessons that I had learnt **about leadership. Then I asked them, "What can you teach ME, about leadership? What have you learnt about what a leader is?" Their responses were simply astounding, and** showed the most remarkable depth of reflection and maturity. We chatted together for nearly an hour, and the students were so engaged we could have kept talking with one another for a further hour! It is such a credit to our schools that our young people are being formed with such perspectives. As I shared with them, because of their wonderful example, I do not feel as alone in my own leadership. We are leaders together! Such a moment of blessing was, for me, a sure sign of the power of goodness that the shadows of inhumanity can never overcome.

Then, on Thursday evening, a number of our community came together to share a meal and friendship, listen to the Word of God, and break open that Word in discussion and sharing with one another. This, too, demonstrates the beauty of the Spirit of God that inbreaks into the darkness of our world. Do think of joining us on a Thursday evening during the remaining weeks of Lent. We start at 7pm at Prouille. Dinner is provided and we are home by 9pm, yet greatly enriched.

While we need to make a big effort, we recognise that reconciliation is always the **initiative of God's boundless mercy and love.**

A Letter to the Mufti of Australia by Fr David as Diocesan Administrator in the wake of the Christchurch murders

21 March 2019

Your Excellency,

The events of 15 March 2019 in Christchurch are etched indelibly now in our minds and in our hearts. Through you, I extend the sympathy of the Catholic Diocese of Broken Bay to the Muslim people of New Zealand (and Australia) who have been the target of this senseless brutality which we utterly reject and condemn. We stand with you in shock and in grief in the face of the evil that has been perpetrated.

As those who have died in such a callous way are now laid to their rest, we hear the cry of the agony of those who have survived, those who have lost their loved ones, those who have lost hope and now despair in the inhumanity that we have experienced. We hear the echoes of their distress and confusion in our own hearts as we remember in prayer all those whose lives will no longer be the same. We wish you to know that we are your brothers and sisters, and though our voice is feeble before such horrific events, we want to say to you that we stand with you in compassion and hope.

It has been my own privilege to be in personal dialogue with you on several occasions over the last years. On such occasions we have lamented together the emergence of a culture of suspicion and fear which can spawn the mindset that **leads to last Friday's carnage. In no small way has this been fueled by the demonization of Islam. Again, I reiterate with you, at this sad time, the immorality and unacceptability of this. It creates ghettos of fear. It cuts us off from each other into networks of defenses. It renders us less than the truth of ourselves about which the French writer Louis Massignon wrote, "Only in exercising hospitality towards another (instead of colonizing him), in sharing the same work, the same bread, as honorable companions can one understand the Truth that unites us socially . . . One can only find truth through the practice of hospitality." (Opera Minora III, 608-9)**

In the face of the terrorism we affirm the pathway of love, rather than the pathway of fear. This can present as naively ridiculous, yet its power is manifest in the stories of heroism and forgiveness in the mosques of last Friday that display a light stronger than the darkness. Genuine love primarily is the decision to listen to the other with the premise that I may **have something to learn from them. The way of love is the commitment to see always the other precisely as 'person' and not through the lens of categorization. It is the practice of an open conversation which seeks to understand the other, to feel with the other, to listen deeply to them. We love the stranger by listening to them, by learning their names, rather than their labels, and by entering their story, often of incalculable pain and dislocation. For the eminent philosopher of 'the other,' Emmanuel Levinas, the "presence of 'the other' announces, commands, perforates, ruptures, unsettles. And that is their gift to us."**

This conversation has yet to begin in Australia. If there be an invitation at the heart of our distress about last Friday, it is the imperative to commit to the critical importance of such dialogue. Our future lies in the conversion of a conversation **about** the other in our midst to one **with** the other.

I express to you on behalf of the Catholic Diocese of Broken Bay our readiness to work always with you in this endeavor. In the meantime, however, all of us in the Diocese reach out to embrace the pain you feel. May our solidarity and our shared hope for a better society represent a flicker of peace in the torment of this time.
