What does the Word say to us this Sunday?

First Reading (Jeremiah 31:7-9). The prophet foretells the return of God's people from exile in Babylon. Even the most helpless will share in the joy of this great event.

Second Reading (Hebrews 5:1-6). This reading sets out the things that are required of a priest, and shows how Christ met these perfectly.

Gospel (Mark 10:46-52). In today's Gospel we meet a blind many by the name of Bartimaeus. When he met Jesus his prayer was: 'Lord, that I may see.' It is a prayer which we can make our own because in many ways we too are blind.

The First Reading carries a message of joyful hope for the exiles in Babylon. The Lord will save what's left of his people and bring them back from exile. Even the most helpless will share in the joy of this great event.

In Mark's mind Jesus is the one who brings salvation (saving people from a life of sin and its consequences). His healings are a sign of the coming of the kingdom.

The story of Bartimaeus is as much a vocational story as a healing story. The expression 'followed him along the way' doesn't simply mean that he joined the crowd on the road to Jerusalem. There can be no doubt what Mark intends: Bartimaeus followed Jesus on the way of Christian discipleship. He is presented as a model of faith.

It seems that the story was used in the early church as a model of encouragement to believers and would-be believers. Bartimaeus serves as a model for those who are spiritually blind and whose lives lack direction.

Reflection on this Sunday's reading:



Bartimaeus is a model.

"He represents the person who has lost the light and knows it."

Others lose the light and refuse to acknowledge it.

Bartimaeus, in the Gospel account, simply says: "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me."

When Christ asks him what he wants, he replies: "Lord, that I may see."

What are we to make of this response?

"Bartimaeus represents every person aware of his pain and crying out to the Lord, confident of being healed."

"The interpretation of St. Augustine that Bartimaeus was a man who had fallen from a condition of 'great prosperity' causes us to think.

It invites us to reflect on the fact that our lives contain precious riches that we can lose, and I am not speaking of material riches here."

All Saints Day: Monday, 1st November

- Reflecting on Purgatory

The Church's teaching on Purgatory should be a source of encouragement. "Purgatory is the state of those who die in God's friendship, assured of their eternal salvation, but who still have need of purification to enter into the glory of God and happiness of heaven." (see CCC nn1030-31; 1054)

As the name itself indicates, the Church's belief is in a blessed transformation and purification that makes those who have died ready to enter finally into God's eternal friendship, to share all things in communion with God. Given our sin and human frailty, few of us die ready for this.

This mysterious transition involves the pain of the final roots of our sin and selfishness being removed, so as to experience communion with God in eternal happiness.





Saints we remember this week



Sts Simon and Jude—1st century AD Feast Day 28th October

Saint Simon the Apostle, also called **Simon the Zealot**, one of the Twelve Apostles. Nothing further is known about him from the New Testament. He supposedly preached the Gospel in Egypt and then joined the apostle St. Judas (Thaddaeus) in Persia, where, according to the apocryphal Acts of Simon and Judas, he was martyred by being cut in half with a saw.

St Jude (also known as Judas Thaddaeus), was one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus. He was also called Thaddeus. Saint Jude is known as the "patron saint of lost causes". The Church wanted to encourage worship of this "forgotten" apostle, and maintained that Saint Jude would help in any lost cause to prove his sanctity and devotion for Christ.
