Rally for Life

What an incredible event at Martin Place last Tuesday night - with many Hornsby and Wahroonga parishioners present! It was estimated that over 10,000 people were at the rally and what a wonderful experience it was to join with so many others to show our politicians how we feel about the Healthcare Reform Bill.

A petition of 77,000 signatures was delivered to the Upper House - we estimate now that more than 100,000 signatures have been obtained.

The current situation is that the Upper House will not vote on the Bill until mid-September and the Premier has indicated that Members can propose amendments so we have more time to continue to ensure that the main points of opposition can continue to be made. This Bill has been promoted as a simple act that decriminalises the act of abortion - but in creating a new law it takes the current position far further:1. Abortions permissible on the basis of gender 2. Abortions on demand to 5 months 3. Abortions up until birth with 2 doctors signature (not solely medical grounds) 4. Doctors liable to professional disciplinary action if they fail to refer a patient to another doctor that they know will perform a termination - despite a conscientious objection to participating in any part of a termination including referring a patient for one. 5. No obligation to provide life saving treatment to a baby that survives the abortion procedure.

The right to life is a right given to all humans from the moment of their conception. We should be doing all we can to create a society that supports women not one that continues to make this the easiest option.

In your immense love, grant to your Church a pastor who will please you by his holiness and aid us with his unfailing care.


In your time, grant us the joy of welcoming


