# Readings for Christmas Masses

For the Solemnity of Christmas, the Church sets out a range of Readings according to the time of day the Mass is celebrated. Some adaptation of these is allowed for pastoral reasons.

#### Vigil Mass (Readings will be adapted for children)

First Reading: Isaiah 62.1-5

Isaiah looks forward to the day when all people will see the glory of God revealed.

Second Reading: Acts 13.16-17,22-25 St Paul declares his faith in Jesus Christ, the One sent by God.

#### Gospel: Matthew 1.1-25

The ancestors of Jesus' line are named. Joseph is told by the Angel of the Lord to care for Mary and her child.

#### **Midnight Mass**

First Reading: Isaiah 9:1-7

This prophecy, about the coming of a Saviour-child who will rescue his people from oppression, is fulfilled in Jesus.

#### Second Reading: Titus 2:11-14

St Paul reminds us of what is expected of us if we are to enjoy the salvation won for us by Christ.

#### Gospel: Luke 2:1-14

This tells about the birth of Jesus, and how the news of his birth was brought by angels to shepherds.

#### 8.00am Mass

#### First Reading: Isaiah 62:11-12

The joy of the exiles returning from Babylon is a foretaste of the joy Christians experience at the birth of Jesus.

#### Second Reading: Titus 3:4-7

We did nothing to merit the birth of Jesus; rather, God sent his Son out of compassion for us.

#### Gospel: Luke 2:15-20

With Mary we are invited to ponder on the deeper meaning of the birth of Jesus so that, with the shepherds, we may be moved to glorify and praise God.

#### 9.30am Mass

**First Reading: Isaiah 9:1-7** This prophecy, about the coming of a Saviour-child who will rescue his people from oppression, is fulfilled in Jesus.

#### Second Reading: Titus 2:11-14

St Paul reminds us of what is expected of us if we are to enjoy the salvation won for us by Christ.

#### Gospel: Luke 2:1-14

This tells about the birth of Jesus, and how the news of his birth was brought by angels to shepherds.

#### Other Readings for Mass on Christmas Day

#### First Reading: Isaiah 52:7-10

This great hymn of exultation at the return of the exiles from Babylon is also a poem of joy for our redemption.

#### Second Reading: Hebrews 1:1-6

The whole history of God's dealings with his people in the past was a preparation for the coming of his Son at a particular moment in history.

#### Gospel: John 1:1-18

This is a great hymn to the Word of God, the source of all life, whose coming among us makes us children of God.
