From Fr Paul

This Sunday, 25 July it is the *World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly*. It is the elderly members of our communities who are particularly vulnerable during this time of lockdown and the presence of COVID-19 in our community. It is timely then this Monday, 26 July, we honour Saints Joachim and Anne, parents of Mary and **grandparents of Jesus**.

From the *Protoevangelium of James* (150AD), we learn the accepted names of Mary's parents, **Joachim and Anne**, as well as the tradition that the couple was childless until an angel appeared to Anne and told her that she would conceive.

Let us reflect on **this beautiful verse** adapted from the Byzantine Daily Worship "Today St Anne claps her hands for joy, the earth radiates with light, kings sing their happiness, priests enjoy every blessing, the entire universe rejoices, for she who is Queen and the Father's immaculate bride buds forth from the stem of Jesse."

Though little is known of the historical Joachim and Anne, **the truth is** that it was Mary's parents who nurtured her, taught her, brought her up to be the worthy Mother of the Lord. **It was their teaching** that led her to respond to God's request with faith, "Let it be done to me as you will." **It was their example** of parenting that Mary must have followed as she brought up her own son, Jesus. **It was their faith** that laid the foundation of courage and strength that allowed her to stand by the cross as her son was crucified and keep faith in the promises of God.

As a community of faith, we honour grandparents and the elderly, and we express our love and gratitude for those who have enriched our lives.

Take care. Stay safe. Let us recognise the presence of the Lord even when things are difficult for us. Like Mary, may we each be willing to say our 'Yes' to God. Fr Paul

What does the Word say to us this Sunday?

First Reading (2 Kings 4:42-44). The miraculous food which the prophet Elisha gave to hungry people was a sign of God's concern for his people.

Second Reading (Ephesians 4:1-6). St Paul pleads with the Ephesians to live a life in keeping with the Gospel, placing special emphasis on the need for unity and harmony.

Gospel (John 6:1-15). Like Elisha, Jesus feeds the people miraculously, but does so even more astonishingly.

For this and the coming Sundays the Gospel readings come from Chapter Six of St John's Gospel, the Bread of Life discourse.

The miracle described in the First Reading shows God's concern for his people during a time of famine. The bread in question was the bread of the first-fruits, which was meant to be offered to God. But instead of offering it to God, Elisha, the prophet of the old covenant, gave it to the people. The left-overs stress God's generosity.

Like Elisha, Jesus, the prophet of the new covenant, feeds hungry people, and does so even more astonishingly. There are clear Eucharistic overtones in the way the miracle is related. Jesus 'took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to the people'. Such language is meant to remind us of what he did at the Last Supper, and of what happens every time we celebrate the Eucharist.

This is expressed beautifully in the prayer which the priest says over the bread at the Offertory of the Mass:

'Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation. Through your goodness we have this bread to offer, which earth has given and human hands have made. It will become for us the bread of life.'

Reflection/Quote for the Week

The earliest account of the Last Supper is in Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians (11:23-25) composed in Ephesus c.53AD: 'The Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed (Greek: paradidômi – perhaps better translated 'handed over') took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said,

This is my body that is for you.

Do this in remembrance of me."

In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying,


"This cup is the new covenant in my blood.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Jesus wants his disciples to 'remember' when his life is so brutally taken from him that he is not simply a victim of his enemies. He has always given himself for them. On the cross this self-giving will reach its consummation.

In Paul's words: 'He loved me and gave himself (paradidômi) for me' (Galatians 2:20).

When he breaks bread that evening, and when he pours out the blood-red wine, he invests them with a special meaning, symbolising the final offering he is about to make. When they take and eat this bread, he wants them to know that it is his body that they are taking, given as a gift of love to them to nourish them on their journey.



When they take and drink this wine, he wants them to know that it is his life poured out for them that he is offering to their thirsting souls.
